I. Slide1 Intro

- A. Slide2 Our churches 2nd Value is...Participation: *Encouraging <u>all</u> believers to <u>discover</u> & <u>use</u> their unique ministry gifts. [don't be like those who <u>watch</u> all the cooking shows, but then are <u>afraid</u> to get in the kitchen!]*
- B. Slide3 List of gifts & categories of gifts. [list not complete. many ways to categorize]
 - 1. Establishing Gifts (Eph.4:11 & 1Cor.12:29): *Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, and Pastor-Teachers.* [Gifts used primarily for <u>planting</u> & <u>growing</u> churches]
 - 2. Supporting Gifts (Rom.12:6-8): *Prophecy, Service, Teaching, Encouragement, Giving, Administration/Leadership, and Mercy.* [Gifts used primarily to <u>organize</u> and <u>administrate</u> the church]
 - 3. Ministry Gifts (1Cor.12:8-10, 27-31): Wisdom, Knowledge, Faith, Healing, Miracles, Prophecy, Helps, Administration, Leadership, Distinguishing Spirits, Speaking in Tongues, and Interpreting Tongues. [These are the tools that the Holy Spirit utilizes for the ongoing ministry of the church]
- C. Slide4a A gift is by grace, which is the very core of the word gift.
 - 1. Grace = χαρισ. Gift = χαρισμα. Gift \mathbf{s} = χαρισματον.
 - 2. Slide4b We are saved by grace grow by grace endowed/gifted by grace.
 - a) *Charismatic* today refers to those who hold the gifts are <u>for today</u>, in which we most definitely do.

D. Slide5 2 Helpful Reminders:

- 1. Chuck Smith, No Holy Spirit and you dry up. Too much Holy Spirit and you blow up. Right balance and you grow up.
- 2. These should be **Tools** to <u>build</u> with, not **Weapons** to <u>slay</u> with, nor **Toys** to <u>play</u> with.
- E. Why are gifts important? They are a reminder **you** can't do everything and that **you** need community. [Imagine if 1 or more parts of your body stopped functioning, or worse, began to perform functions they weren't designed to do?]

- 1. The church needs <u>you</u>, and <u>your functioning gifts</u>.
- F. Paul & Cindy Lester: give a little background on yourselves.

II. Slide6 QUESTIONS

- A. What's the difference between **spiritual** gifts and **natural** gifts?
 - 1. K I believe you can have gifts even if you don't know it or recognize it.
 - 2. Natural talents = given by God thru parents. Learned skills = learned by us. Spiritual gifts = gifts that God gives.
- B. Do you get to pick your own gifts? (nope HS. Can pray for certain one's though)
- C. Do you have to be *really spiritual* to get a gift? (no, *look at Corinth church*)
- D. Do you remember receiving one of your gifts? How did that happen?
 - 1. K What are my spiritual gifts: well, I think...teaching, discernment, administration, leadership, word of knowledge and wisdom. When needed, helps, hospitality at times. He gives me these because He knows I need them for what I do.
 - a) Teaching was just strong on my heart and although discouraged, knew God had it in my future. Discernment was one I realized I had soon on because honestly I just "know stuff" about people He warns me, gives me a check in my spirit, etc. As I'm teaching or counseling, knowledge and wisdom will come into play. He give same hospitality when I need it.
 - b) Honestly *I prayed and asked God for gifts.* No one encouraged me, no one talked to me or told me what they thought I had, I didn't take any tests. So I sought the Lord, the Word, and then just stepped out and "worked it out" with fear and trembling!
- E. Are spiritual gifts the best signs of spirituality? (no, fruit of spirit)
 - K Gifts are spiritual things, so not always make sense. I think they overlap at times with our strengths, talents, and abilities. Our talents provide ways in which to use our gifts.
- F. Does every believer have a gift?

- 1. Donald gee said, The Holy Spirit for His own wise reason imparts to every person a special gift for the special service to which he is called.
- 2. K I think you can have <u>multiple gifts</u> that can work together to do the ministry He's called you to. [Eg. Teaching, often comes w/wisdom, discernment, knowledge]
- G. Are some gifts **more important** than others? (yes *prophecy* is over *tongues*. Their value is based on its usefulness to the church)
 - 1. Electrician toolbelt. The best tool depends on the job at hand.
- H. Can spiritual gifts be **misused**? (look at Corinth)
- I. How do I identify and unwrap my spiritual gift(s)?
 - 1. **Know** what gifts are available.
 - 2. **Be available** to receive the gift (you can't give a gift to someone who won't receive it)
 - 3. **Pray** for God's gift He's designed for you (He has your name on it already)
 - 4. Step out **in Faith** (eg. Be bold in the Word of Knowledge)
 - 5. Don't wait around to feel gifted, earnestly desire the best gifts.
 - 6. K First, **pray**. I think the key word is pray **INTENTIONALLY** and ask God to show you. Pay attention to **what energizes you** and is your **passion**. Quote, "Every spiritual gift gives off clues. Your spiritual gift will usually cause you to react a certain way in a given situation. If there's a problem, people with the gift of leadership will try to find a solution. For those who are gifted as shepherds, they will immediately be concerned that the people are cared for and growing in Christlikeness as a result. Those with the gift of intercession will immediately say, We need to pray abut this."
 - a) Ask mature bel's around you what they see in you.
 - b) Volunteer at church, try things out, to see if it's a fit or not.
 - c) Develop your gifts. Practice, learn, study, awn into flame.

- K. Congregationally we don't focus on the gifts but on the Giver!
- L. 3 Challenges concerning Gifts:

- 1. 1 Cor.12:31 earnestly desire the best gifts.
- 2. 1 Tim.4:14 do not neglect the gift that is in you. [like muscles, gifts will atrophy if not used]
- 3. 2 Tim.1:6 stir up the gift of God which is in you.
- M. Swindoll gives great advice about gifts, Your gift is a privilege; so <u>accept</u> it, but don't <u>flaunt</u> it. Your gift is a responsibility; so <u>use</u> it, don't <u>abuse</u> it.
- N. If these gifts are functioning properly the church will be:
 - 1. Genuinely spiritual (controlled by the Spirit so that we minister to His people).
 - 2. Spontaneous (serving from the heart rather than from a sense of legislated duty).
 - 3. Sacrificial (generously sharing time, money, energy, & talent).
- O. K We need to learn how to **celebrate other's gifts**, not be jealous of them.
 - 1. Learn how to use your gifts together as a team to be unified in purpose, etc.
 - 2. We all need each other's gifts...we are the church we need to move as a united front both to encourage and build up body and reach out to others.
