John 1:1-13 10-7-18

John's Flash Bang

I. Slide1 Announce:

- A. Slide2-4 Larry: Office Closed. Night of Hope. Married Couples.
- B. Slide5 Sun Night of Prayer: tonight 6:30-7:30.
- C. Slide6 Freedom Gala this Sat: Awareness & fund raiser for Destiny Rescue. They just celebrated the **rescue** of its **3,000th** *trafficking survivor* from the sex trade.
 - 1. Become a part of *the freedom story* for 100's of children around the world.

II. Slide7,8 Intro: John's Flash Bang

- A. A Flash Bang or Stun Grenade momentarily activates *all photoreceptor cells in the eye* blinding it for approximately 5 seconds. Afterwards, the victim sees an *after-image* that impairs his or her *aim*. The loud blast temporarily deafens the victim and also disturbs the fluid in the ear, causing loss of balance.
 - 1. John starts his gospel with *a flash bang*. See John and the apostles *tripped, staggered & were blinded* multiple times for over 3 years, figuring out *Jesus was the Messiah*.
 - 2. John doesn't want you & I to go through that. So John blasts into the room of our minds, fast, sudden & w/o warning w/a spiritual stun grenade that briefly shocks, astonishes, dazes us right from the beginning...Slide9...that JESUS IS GOD!

III. Slide10 Book Intro:

- A. The Gospel of John. My 4th time through John (and NT).
- B. The Authorship of John. This is the *Apostle* John, the disciple whom Jesus loved (5 x's) [Jn.21:20*Then Peter*, turning around, saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following, who also had leaned on His breast at the supper].
 - 1. So this is a close account, not someone writing a 100 years later trying to figure it out. No, this was an intimate friend writing his Divinely Inspired Witness.
- C. Why did John write a 4th gospel? (last written, known as 4th) [all seem to be b4 *Jer's dest* AD70]
 - 1. Slide11 Matthew wrote to the Jews. Portrays Jesus as Messiah. Tells us what Jesus said
 - 2. Mark wrote to the Romans. Portrays Jesus as Servant. Tells us what Jesus did.

- 3. Luke wrote to the Greeks. Portrays Jesus as The Man. Tells us what Jesus felt.
- 4. **John** wrote to the world. Portrays Jesus as Divine. *Tells us who Jesus was*.
- D. John writes *topically* not chronologically.
 - 1. We also get **6 miracles** we didn't know about. The upper room teachings (ch14-17). And, we learn **over 90% of John** is *unique* to his gospel.
- E. Slide12 Key verse: Jn.20:30,31 And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; 31 but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.
 - 1. Slide13 **Deity** Jesus is the Christ (to make His deity crystal clear).
 - a) Coin: 2 sides of a coin are both valid. So Jesus has 2 natures, both valid.
 - b) Even ends with Thomas' testimony of Jesus, my Lord & my God.
 - 2. Slide14 **Belief** that believing you might have life in His name [**Believe** is key word. 98 x's]

IV. Slide15 JESUS PREINCARNATE (1-5)

- A. Genesis starts with *In the beginning*, God speaking **creation** into existence. **John** starts with *In the beginning*, God speaking **salvation** into existence.
- B. Jesus' Relationship to *THE FATHER* (1,2)
- C. Slide16a He is Eternal (He always existed) 3 genealogy's?
 - Mt.1 gives us Jesus' genealogy through Joseph, going back to Abraham, to show the Jews, His *legal* rt to the throne.
 - 2. Lk.3 gives us Jesus' genealogy through Mary, going back to Adam, to show the **Gentiles**, His *natural/genetic* rt to the throne.
 - 3. John's intro gives us Jesus' genealogy through **eternity**, going back to His Father, to show the **World**, His **sovereign** rt to the throne.
- D. Slide 16b Jesus the Word is Preexistent.
 - 1. Jesus was *with God*. Jesus is distinct from God the Father (Jesus was *with God*), and yet they have an intimate relationship with each other.

- 2. Jesus was God. They also share the same character, quality and essence of God (Jesus was God). So, a distinction between and yet a unity in all other regards.
- E. Slide17a He's introduced as The Word (logos) He's one w/the very being & mind of God
 - 1. He is the expression & intelligence & will & power of God.
 - 2. The fact that He is *the Word of God* shows us that He wants to *communicate* with people.
 - 3. Slide17b A word is composed of letters, & Christ is the alpha & omega (& includes every letter in-between) who spells out God's love to us...in word's we can understand
 - 4. God had been revealed in part *through nature* & *history*, but now is known *through His Son*.
 - a) When an OT Prophet said, *thus saith the Lord*, their words were accepted as God's words, because they spoke as *representatives of God*.
 - b) In the East, representatives who carry messages from the King are honored with the honor due a king. The kings words must be respected and obeyed. Any remark against his utterances would be regarded as an offense against his own person.
- F. Slide 18a Jesus' Relationship to THE WORLD (3-5)
- G. He is Sole Creator (nothing exists that He didn't make)
- H. Creation is the universal proof of the reality of God. It clearly testifies that an awesome Creator must exist.
 - 1. John comes out of the shoot with the fact that the **origin** of our world is *creation*.
 - 2. The world was made through Him (10) [i.e. not just blind chance]
- I. He is Light & Life (His life gives light to everyone; the darkness can't extinguish it)
 - 1. 1st creative act by God (Gen.1) was producing light, for life comes from light.
- J. Jesus was uncreated. *All things were made through Him/*Jesus. Creation back in Genesis came through *the Divine Word* when Yahweh spoke forth the universe into existence.

- 1. **Physical matter** did not give rise to **life**. **Life** gave rise to **matter**. Once there was only **life** and no **matter**. Then that personal **life** created **matter**, and there was both **life** and **matter**.
- 2. Slide18b Let me hit the pause button. Be worshipful as you read this book.
 - a) Think of Jesus as creator. Think of the Potter forming the clay...only it's much more than that. See, He made the clay, He made the water. [He formed me! yes, but He made you & sustains you also]
- K. Jesus is the **Life** giver. *In Him was life*. The Word is the source of life, both **physical** through the creation of all things, and **spiritual** looking ahead (6:35 *I am the bread of life*. *He who <u>comes to Me</u> shall never hunger, and he who <u>believes in Me</u> shall never thirst).*
 - 1. Throughout his gospel <u>John</u> will view **life** mainly as: *new life, spiritual life, saving life, the gift of eternal life*.
- L. Jesus is the Light giver. Light. Speaking to the initial act of *creation*, also a metaphor for *salvation* and *spiritual awakening*.
- M. Slide 19 Note: This is what it means to be God. Where did God come from mommy?
 - God didn't come from anywhere, He was always there. He never had a beginning. He was there before anything else was there. He made everything else. There wasn't anything before God. (John Piper, Jn.1)
 - 2. God is life. He is alive. He is a living person. Not a human person. But a divine person. Alive, doing something like thinking and feeling for all of eternity. As far back as you can go in eternity, forever and ever and ever and ever, there is one changeless reality life. Divine, personal life. Ultimate reality, absolute reality, original reality is alive. In Him was life.

V. Slide20,21 JESUS INCARNATE (6-13)

- A. JOHN (6-8)
- B. Bear witness *This gospel is a record of testimony*, & shows that faith is belief founded upon evidence. (Erdman)
 - 1. Slide22a What the moon is to the sun, so John is to Jesus.
 - 2. The **moon** being *the lesser light* that reflects the **sunlight**.

- C. John the author/apostle gives eve witness in vs.14, and we beheld His glory.
- D. Slide22b,c (7) Believe John's Gospel never uses the *noun* faith, always the *verb* believe.
 - 1. This stylistic difference makes John's presentation of salvation much more concrete & immediate. An **active**, **relational** reality *more than a static concept*.
 - 2. Faith is a **verb** in John's Gospel: something to act upon and live out, not just to behold.
- E. Slide23 (10,11) 2 of the saddest verses in the bible.
 - 1. Slide24 In Wales there is a village, Beddgelert, the name of which means "The grave of Gelert". There is a famous legend about this Gelert, which was a dog, the hound of Llewellyn the Great. One day, on returning to his castle, Llewellyn found his child lying dead, & the hound Gelert laying beside it. Llewellyn at once plunged his sword in to the poor animal, only to discover too late a huge wolf had attacked the child, & the faithful hound had slain it. In his blind rage, Llewellyn had killed a faithful friend.
 - a) In a far more terrible sense, that is what *all Christ-rejectors* are doing today.
- F. (12) But the Gospel of John isn't only about the tragedy of *unbelief*, it is also the great drama of the unfolding of faith.
 - Jesus' presentation of salvation is interesting. He narrates salvation into being through leisurely conversation, intimate personal relationships, compassionate responses, passionate prayer, and putting it all together, in a sacrificial death. You don't casually walk away from words like that. [adapted from Eugene Peterson, intro of John in MSG]
- G. Received if the doctors said, <u>this flu vaccine works for everyone</u>. We would know he means <u>everyone</u> who <u>takes</u> it. So in vs.9, the true light enlightens everyone, that is everyone who <u>receives</u> it.
- H. Slide25 (13) This new birth is:
 - 1. Not of Blood not by heredity or inheritance. [also, not over & over again (think Nic)]
 - 2. Not of the will of the flesh not by natural instinct.
 - 3. Nor of the will of man not by human volition.

- 4. Slide26 But of God by the direct, supernatural exercise of divine power.
- I. Slide27 End: In the early 1800's, President Andrew Jackson issued a full pardon to George Wilson, a man sentenced to be hanged. Wilson refused it. But could he legally refuse the President's pardon? Supreme Court Justice John Marshall declared, "The value of the pardon depends upon its acceptance. If it is refused, it is no pardon. George Wilson must hang." And Wilson was hanged.
 - To pardon your sin, Christ shed His blood on the cross. The price was paid.
 But each individual <u>must</u> first receive this forgiveness.
 - 2. Everything hangs on this *other* birth, this 2nd birth, being born again, being born of God. Without this...we are *spiritually* **dead** and *spiritually* **blind**.
 - a) The remedy?...sending Jesus into the world as the light of life to *lay down His life* for yours.
