John 12:27-50

From Present Tragedy to Ultimate Triumph

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I. Slide1 Announce:

- A. Slide2-7 AL: Children's. Baptism. Women's Worship. Movie. Bridges. MOMS (Jessica).
- B. Slide8 Children at Risk: updates & prayer meeting.
- C. Slide9 UPD, Rohingya put RO on check.
- D. Prayer: But far be it from me to boast <u>except</u> in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. And Jesus we are looking to You, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before You <u>endured</u> the cross, <u>despising</u> the shame, & is <u>seated</u> at the right hand of the throne of God

II. Slide10 Intro: From Present Tragedy to Ultimate Triumph

- A. Illust: A young Christian student offered his life for overseas missionary service & labors hard at study to become a qualified doctor, is suddenly afflicted with an illness the very year he qualifies, & is informed that he can never go out as a missionary. Is God mocking him? These life enigmas make our baffled minds & our frustrated longings scream, *Why?*
 - That young medical graduate, who could not go out as a missionary learned to find his ultimate triumph beyond his present tragedy. For he was used to influence & train 100's for the overseas field work; & today there is a large missionary memorial hospital erected in his venerated memory.
 - 2. This morning we'll see your ultimate triumph beyond your present tragedy.
- B. Jesus is preoccupied with one thing, His Cross. From vs.23-50 as His last public teaching.
 - 1. The Cross was His final word, His final answer.

III. Slide11a THE ANGUISH (27) soul trouble

- A. (27,28) My soul is troubled everything which really counts, really costs.
 - 1. This internal troubled discussion He had w/in Himself. (no gospel talks about this till Geth)
 - 2. This went beyond the **physical** & **emotional** agony that awaited Him.
 - a) This was the result of bearing the weight of the sin of the whole world, as a sinless being. (you know the weight of bearing past sin...but not as a *sinless being*)

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- 3. Yet, while He contemplated praying to God for deliverance, He *remained on the course* toward what God had willed for Him.
 - a) He was saved not from the hour, but out of the hour.
- B. Slide11b Like *Train Tracks* life seems to be like 2 **Tracks**: *Woeful & Wonderful...going on simultaneously in our lives*.
- C. Woeful
 - 1. Let's be as honest as Jesus...my soul is troubled.
 - 2. Can we say to one another, *emotionally I'm not okay today*. I feel like I was *shot in the soul*. I'm in shock. *I haven't worked this through yet*.
 - 3. Sometimes we feel woeful emotionally (27). Other times physically (33). And still other times relationally (some believed, some didn't. Jesus: I love you. The Jews: well, we don't love you. Jesus: That's ok, I'll die for your sins. The Jews: No thanks, we're good. Jesus: I'm here to help. The Jews: don't need it)
- **D. Wonderful**
 - 1. For this *purpose* I came to this hour. Purpose, or, God's will for us.

E. When suffering ASK...

- 1. What is the character of God & how do I reflect that?
- 2. Go for His Glory, He is working things for our good.
- 3. Slidel1c Suffering (the woeful) is a school you attend to learn the wonderful.
- Just hold your fathers hand like a small child. They don't need to know where you're going. Or, how to make it across the busy street or through the mall. They just need to <u>hold</u> their Fathers hand.
- 5. In a **woeful** time...**wonderful** things happen.

IV. Slide12 THE MASTER PRINCIPLE (28) Father glorify Your name 3x's (also vs.23)

- A. Let's 1st jump down to the *glory's* in vs.43 They loved the praise of men and so do **I**, and so do **you**.
 - 1. Kel & I (& Donna & her twin Sue) had our 40th HS Reunion Fri Night. And once again I was reminded how much I enjoy the *praise of men*. Old friends

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encouraging on *what I've become*. Some with completely diff belief systems saying, *that must be so rewarding*.

- 2. :(I love the praise of men. I love what people think of me. I love my glory. I love my reputation. I love myself...and yes, *sometimes even more than God.*
- B. Now back to 3 glory's in vs.28 Father, glorify Your Name Oh that we would set the promotion of *God's glory* above any thought of ourselves [May this be the *master-principle* of our lives]
 - 1. Father, glorify your name. How do we glorify His name?
 - a) Think mirroring/reflecting. 1 Cor. 10:31 *whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of <u>God</u>. God looks in the mirror & wants to see you.*
 - 2. Bring glory to YOUR Name Lord.

V. Slide13a **THE TRANSFORMATION (31-33)** And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Myself.

- A. From cross to throne. From crucifixion to coronation.
 - 1. Now in the sense of it being certain of happening in the future, He can declare it now as *happened*.
 - 2. When heaven bleeds on the cross, hell is defeated by its own schemes.
- B. Slide13b If I am lifted up exalted. *On a pole like the serpent in the wilderness* (3:14).
 - 1. This is obviously speaking of His crucifixion (33).
 - 2. Yet here, *Calvary is Transformed* He looks beyond the revolting externals to the inner glory & ultimate triumph of it.
 - 3. His **crucifixion** became His **coronation**. This is how the world would be rescued.
 - 4. Paul said, the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. Gal.2:20
 - 5. Yes, *Calvary is Transfigured* redeeming grace transforms the **Cross** into a **Throne**. What can you transform in your life?
- C. Can you see your ultimate triumph beyond your present tragedy?

- William Cowper, the famous Hymn writer wrote, Judge not the Lord by feeble sense, But trust Him for His grace; Slide14 Behind a <u>frowning</u> providence, God hides a <u>smiling</u> face.
- 2. See your ultimate triumph beyond your present tragedy.

VI. Slide15a **THE MAGNET (31-33)** And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will *draw* all people to Myself

- A. The cross, the divine magnet. The tragic, yet magnetic Cross. Which *draws* all peoples to Him. And our attitude toward it shows what we are *either steel shavings* drawn to it, or *ashes* that feel *no magnetic draw*.
- B. Slide15b The Cross...the most eloquent word in all *the vocabulary of God*. The Cross: that which showed how much He was **hated**, is that for which He is now most **loved**.

VII.Slide16a **THE TARGET (32)** And *I*, when *I* am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Myself

- A. God, the ultimate target of sin.
 - 1. Whatever **sin** you commit, in its *final meaning* it is a wound inflicted upon God.
 - a) Sin is not just a breaking of **His law**, but a wounding of **His heart**.
 - b) And that is why He was there at Calvary, as that *broken-hearted sufferer*.
 - 2. Jesus took our place.
 - a) Love transfigures Calvary...then Calvary transfigures everything else.
- B. Note the wording, And I, when I am lifted up from the earth.
 - Christ + Cross. A cross does not save us. Jesus without a cross cannot save us. It was Jesus on the cross which saves us. And I (Jesus), when I am lifted up (cross).
 - 2. It's not Christ apart from the Cross who draws and saves.
 - a) We can't preach His model life, without his disgraceful death. Man does not just need a *beautiful portrait*, but a **cure** for their sin-disease.
 - 3. It's not the Cross apart from Christ who draws and saves.

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- a) The cross is is not a detached transaction which in itself can save. Believe in <u>it</u> for a free entry-permit into heaven.
- 4. Nope. It is *the Christ of Calvary*, and He alone, who really saves and really draws.
 - a) Slide16b It's not *a man on a tree* who saves (as there were many). But *the deity - behind the man - on a tree - transformed into a torture stake*.
 - b) Wonderful Christ. Wonderful Cross.

VIII.Slide17a THE NEED (35,36) Light is among you

- A. Walk while you have the light doesn't mean much to us who can now *make light* (we have electricity in every home, street lights everywhere, flashlights, back up lights, night lights, candles, & even carry flashlights 24/7...on our cell phones)
 - Back in the mid-90's when we 1st joined Harold & Natalie in Haiti (before generators, before solar power) we had to rely upon *Hinche Electric* (which was a giant Generator in town, that they would run, if & when they had diesel. And if & when they decided to run it)
 - 2. We understood after dinner time, A little while longer the light is with you. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you; he who walks in darkness does not know where he is going. While you have the light, believe in the light.

a) Seek the Lord while He may be found.

- B. Unbelievers believe we're good & getting better; we're light & getting brighter.Believers believe we're bad & getting worse; & no it's dark & getting darker.
 - 1. Slide17b Jesus is Light we need to **believe** in the Light. To become **sons of** the Light. To **walk** in His Light.

IX. Slide18 THE RESPONSE (37,42) varied. did not believe. believed in Him.

- A. In His words & works, Jesus showed Israel the light, but they chose to walk in *darkness*.
 - 1. Jesus tells the Jewish crowd their unbelief was *predicted* centuries b4 by Isaiah.
- B. Slide19 Quick Infomercial on Isaiah:

- 1. Isaiah is quoted far more in the NT, than any other prophet. 21 mentioned x's by name. Ch.53 is quoted, or alluded to, at least 85 x's in the NT.
- C. Isaiah known as the Mini-Bible. (66 chapters/66 books)
 - 1. The 1st 39 ch's are like the OT's 39 books. The next 27 ch's are like the NT.
 - a) Ch.1-39 are a message of Judgment (on immorality & Idolatry).
 - b) Ch.40-66 are a message of Hope (Messiah is coming as Savior & Sovereign. To bear a cross & to wear a crown).
- D. Isaiah = Yahweh is Salvation (excellent summary of the book!)
 - 1. Deutero-Isaiah, or 2nd Isaiah theory (Deuteronomy=2nd Law. early & later Isaiah) is destroyed here, with Jesus quoting from both "*sides*" of Isaiah.
 - a) Jesus quoted from Isaiah 8x's from the early section, & 8x's from the later section,
 & each time Jesus uses Isaiah's name.
- E. (39) They could not believe not because their freedom of choice had been removed from them, but because they had *purposely rejected God* & chosen evil.
 - 1. Remember which holiday/feast? *Passover*: Would be studying & reading the *Exodus*.
 - a) eg. Pharaoh story. And God hardened Pharaohs heart. (*wait!* 19 x's. 1/2, God hardened Pharaoh's heart. 1/2, Pharaoh hardened his own heart)
 - 2. Thus like Pharaoh, God turned them over to their own choices.
 - a) They did not believe (37) [though they'd seen the evidence for His divine Sonship] They could not believe (39) [cuz their hearts had become hard & their eyes blind] They should not believe (40) [because they had spurned His grace]
- F. Hardened formation of a callous.
- G. Habits are formed by the result of our choices.
 - 1. Our day by day choices gradually turn into habits.
 - 2. Example: Trail through a forest! A pioneer can barely see the trail; but when followed by another, then another, years later it becomes a highway.
 - 3. This works for both good & bad habits.

X. Slide20a THE SERIOUSNESS (37,42) whoever believes in me...who rejects me...

A. (44-50) The seriousness of rejecting Jesus is the subject here.

- 1. Why is it so serious to reject Jesus? To reject Jesus is to reject the Father.
- 2. To accept Jesus is to accept the Father, which leads to *life everlasting*.
- B. (35,36) Walk in the light. Believe in the light. And you will become sons of light.
 - 1. It's real simple...Accept Him, before it is too late.
 - Slide20b It's a persevering, life-long, faith-union w/Christ Himself which sanctifies character & conduct. ~ Would you like to start your *faith journey* today?
