## "Embryogenesis!"

## 1. Intro:

- 1.1. **Embryogenesis** is the formation and growth of an *embryo*.
  - 1.1.1. A new human being progresses from a single cell.
  - 1.1.2. When an egg is fertilized it is called a **zygote**.
  - 1.1.3. When the zygote begins to divide it becomes an **embryo**.
  - 1.1.4. After 8 weeks it becomes a **fetus**.
    - 1.1.4.1. A zygote contains a full set of chromosomes, ½ from the male & ½ from the female cell in its inception.
  - 1.1.5. I see the book of Acts as the *Embryogenesis* of the Church.
    1.1.5.1. It shows the **formation** & **growth** of the early Church.
  - 1.1.6. It's a *spiritual Zygote* of the **Holy Spirit** & **man** coming together to bring about **New life!**
- 1.2. Q: How has God's Spirit moved in **our country's history** since its inception?
- 1.3. **1**<sup>st</sup> **Great Awakening** (1720's)
  - Started: Dutch Reformed; spread to Congregationalist, thanks to Jonathan Edwards in Mass.(1734); which sparked George Whitefield & the Wesley's in New England & the Middle Colonies(1739); next to the Presbyterians; Baptists; Methodists.
  - 1.3.2. Results: [1] Widespread conversion [2] Stirring of missionary interest [3] Founding of Evangelical Colleges (The Congregationalist started Yale, Harvard & Dartmouth, Presbyterian Princeton, and Episcopalian Penn and Columbia, & the Baptist started Brown Univ)
  - 1.3.3. At least 10% of New England was converted in the 1<sup>st</sup> Great Awakening.
- 1.4. **2<sup>nd</sup> Great Awakening** (late 1700's) [due to *Concerts of Prayer* set up with diff pastors]
  - 1.4.1. Finney Revival's (early 1800's) N.Y.
  - 1.4.2. The revival of 1858 Quite different. No great names attached to it, laymen were most responsible. Some say it was the **Business** people of N.Y. because of a bank panic, scared people into a new dependence on God. But the 1<sup>st</sup> outbreaks in U.S. in Virginia & the Carolina's occurred among slaves. Ultimately over 100,000 African American's were converted in the 1858 revival.
  - 1.4.3. D.L. Moody (late 1800's)
- 1.5. Evangelical revival:
  - 1.5.1. Azusa St. Revival in LA. (early 1900)
  - 1.5.2. Billy Graham (mid-late 1900's)
  - 1.5.3. Jesus Movement(starting in late 1960's) which we were birthed out of

- 1.6. Some movements were started with God using **popular individuals**; some with the **average Christian business men**, some with **folks** getting together & pleading/praying for revival; but **each** a *deliberate*, *intentional*, *purposeful* moving of the **Holy Spirit**.
- 1.7. The book of **Acts** is simply history written with a purpose.
  - 1.7.1. It is the development of the early church.
  - 1.7.2. No person set out to create the Church. The Holy Spirit birthed it right into the very soul of **His people**.
- 1.8. O: Where is the Church today?
- 1.9. **J. I. Packer** said, "The outside observer sees *the Christian faith* staggering on from gimmick to gimmick and stunt to stunt like so many drunks in a fog, not knowing at all **where we are** or **which way** we should be going. Preaching is hazy; heads are muddled; hearts fret; doubts drain strength; uncertainty paralyzes action. Unlike the 1<sup>st</sup> **Christians** who in 3 centuries won the Roman world, and those **later Christians** who pioneered the **Reformation**, and the **Puritan Awakening** and the **Evangelical Revival**, and **the great missionary movement** of the last century, **we lack certainty.** Why is this? We blame the **external pressures** of modern secularism, but this is like Eve blaming the serpent. The real truth is that **we have grieved the Spirit**...we stand under divine judgment. For 2 generations our churches have suffered from a famine of hearing the words of the Lord."
- 1.10. G.K. Chesterton said, "Christianity has not been **tried** & found **wanting**; it has been found **difficult** & not **tired**."

## 2. INTRO TO ACTS!

- 2.1. **Interesting Nuggets:**
- 2.2. Q: What were Jesus last words(recorded words)? A: The Great Commission in Acts 1:8
- 2.3. I love the intro in my Bible(*Broadman & Holman*), "The book of Acts is the story of the men & women who **took that commission seriously** & began to spread the news of a **risen Savior** to the most **remote corners** of the known world."
- 2.4. **Book Overview:**
- 2.5. Written by Luke. It's **Volume 2**, in a 2-part work.
  - 2.5.1. Luke was a close friend & traveling companion of Paul.
  - 2.5.2. **Ps:** We will be having the actor **David Payne** back out, Wed night Sept.12<sup>th</sup>, "*Prisoner of Passion*" Paul in prison w/Luke by his side, & a slave girl.
  - 2.5.3. Many believe Luke wrote both Luke & Acts while in Rome w/Paul. 2.5.3.1. Paul wrote in 2<sup>nd</sup> Timothy, "only Luke is with me." (4:11)
- 2.6. We know Luke was a Gentile & a Physician.
  - 2.6.1. The *Anti-Marcionite* prologue to Luke's Gospel(2<sup>nd</sup> cent a.d.) states that he was a native of Antioch, Syria, never married, & died in Boeotia(Bee-o-shee-a/ Ancient Greece) at the age of 84.

- 2.7. Luke wrote in the early 60's (he ended Acts w/Paul still awaiting trial in prison)
  2.7.1. The **Emperor Nero** had not yet tuned against the Christians (64 ad)
- 2.8. It records the acts of **Peter**(ch.1-12) & the acts of **Paul**(ch.13-28).
  - 2.8.1. **Peter** used "*the keys*" to open the door of faith to the **Jews**(2); the **Samaritans**(8); & the **Gentiles**(10).
  - 2.8.2. Paul took the good news to the **Gentiles** in the *Roman Empire*.
- 2.9. Some say the best title would be *The Acts of the Holy Spirit through the church!* 
  - 2.9.1. This book then is for **every Christian** who wants to **experience** the **power of the Holy Spirit** & be a **witness** for Jesus Christ "to the end of the earth".<sup>1</sup>
  - 2.9.2. Q: Do you want to experience the <u>power</u> of the Holy Spirit in your life?
  - 2.9.3. Q: What part does God want **you** to play in taking the good news to the world? It simply starts with 1 phrase, like Paul used in 9:6(read).
- 2.10. We can also break it down into **3 sections**:
  - 2.10.1. Ch.'s 1-7; 8-12; 13-28.
  - 2.10.2. Each focus in on: a particular audience, a key personality, & a significant phase in the *expansion* of the gospel message.
    - 2.10.2.1. i.e. Jerusalem Judea & Samaria end of the known earth.
    - 2.10.2.2. Each expansion was brought on by persecution.
    - 2.10.2.3. But they were able to watch the *gospel message* penetrate geographical, social, racial, & religious barriers.
  - 2.10.3. So Acts 1:8 really **outlines** the book!

## 3. THE EMBRYONIC CHURCH! (1-3)

- 3.1. (1) Do & teach Don't you just love the order?
  - 3.1.1. May we not just be known for our *sayings*, but of both our *sayings* & *doings*!
  - 3.1.2. And, may it be said that our *doings* did not clash with our *sayings*!
- 3.2. Jesus **began** both to do & teach Acts is an account of **the continuation** of Jesus' work, through the Holy Spirit, in the early church.
- 3.3. (3) Many infallible proofs The word "*proofs*" occurs only here in the NT, and looks at **demonstrable evidence** in contrast with evidence provided by witnesses.
  - 3.3.1. In other words, the Resurrection was proven by touch, sight, and feel.
  - 3.3.2. Luke 24:39 "Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."
  - 3.3.3. 1 John 1:1 That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched this we proclaim concerning the Word of life

- 3.4. Questions to Ponder: (Think, Dream & Ponder with me on these!)
- 3.5. Q: What is God going to do in/with **our church** by going through this?
- 3.6. Q: What is God going to do in/with **me** by going through this?
- 3.7. Q: How do we or how should we judge if the Spirit is working in our church/in us?
- 3.8. Q: Is our God <u>limited</u> to moving how He did during the Jesus Movement? (i.e. afterglow's?)
- 3.9. Q: Is it about **us** experiencing something, or **the world** experiencing Him?
- 3.10. Q: Would we be satisfied with a world won for Christ & the Father blessed with worshipers...or do we need more?
- 3.11. Q: What if God wanted to emphasize *only* the **boldness of faith** in this next spiritual awakening would we be ok with that?
- 3.12. Q: What will the **next Jesus movement** look like? How will it be **different? Who** will He use?
  - 3.12.1. (Look what it changed last time: youth came back to church; the music style completely changed; the spotlight became what was on the inside, not on what you wore to church; it focused once again on the Essentials of The Book, & not the opinions of The Majority; it took a total different direction then the church was going at the time)
- 3.13. Q: What will the **next Jesus movement** look like? How will it be **different**? **Who** will He use?
- 3.14. Q: Will you offer yourself to **pray for**, to **be used in**, & to **be open to** HIS next move? (moving is changing, & changing is growing)
  - 3.14.1. Growing Faith lives each day with <u>eternity</u> in view!

    Growing Faith isn't afraid to embrace a vision <u>greater</u> than oneself.

    Growing Faith isn't afraid to take on a <u>God sized</u> assignment!

    Growing Faith invests in the most important things...<u>People</u>!
  - 3.14.2. It's being *in mission* with Jesus Christ! (mission = assigned task: a particular task given to a **person** or **group** to carry out)
    3.14.2.1. It is whether or not we are willing to accept **God's mission**, as **our mission**?
    3.14.2.2. If we do... Warning!
- 3.15. Warning: The Devil always fights the church when the church is on the move!
- 3.16. **Charles Spurgeon** used to say that *Satan never kicks a dead horse!*
- 3.17. Satan knew that the church was **on the move**, so he **attacked it**.
  - 3.17.1. In Acts 2 we read that 3000 people were converted.
    3.17.1.1. Then what happened? According to Acts 4, Satan came like a lion and had the apostles **threatened**.
  - 3.17.2. In Ch.5, Satan came like a serpent, influencing Ananias and Sapphira to **infect the church** with their lying and hypocrisy.
    - 3.17.2.1. If Satan can't win by *persecution* from the **outside**, he will try *pollution* on the **inside**.

- 3.17.3. Then Satan came as the accuser in Acts 6. One group of widows accused the other group of widows of taking over. "We are being neglected," they said. Satan likes to get the saints to accuse one another.
- 3.17.4. Then according to Acts 12, Satan came as a murderer. James was killed, and Peter was put into prison to be kept for execution.
- **Next time**(1:4-8) we'll look at **Power**. 3.18.
  - 3.18.1. Jesus didn't only promise the Holy Spirit's Presence to His disciples, but also a desperately needed transfusion of **Power!**<sup>2</sup>
  - 3.18.2. "The Task ahead of you is never as great as the Power behind you!"
