Acts 1:1-3

The Continuing Acts of Jesus

I. Announce:

- A. Slide1-6 AP: Fresh Hope. Men's Brkfst. Retreat. BAM. Hani Prayer. Intro Cameron.
- B. Slide7 Prayer Night (Hani & Iran)
- C. The drone strike of *Qassim Suleimani* is a seismic event in the Middle East. We wait, we watch & we pray. What I do know: Read Acts 17:26-31.
 - 1. *Did you know:* Iran has the fastest growing church in the world (more have come to Christ in the last **20 years** than in the last **1300 yrs** of when Islam swept thru).
- D. Prayer: As we study this book, may it study us. Global size task.

II. Slide8a Intro: ACTS FACTS

- A. My goal: we're not going to study as scholars but as soldiers. It seems scholars and soldiers study history the most. Scholars want to look at *what people <u>used</u> to do*.
 Soldiers want to see *what <u>still needs</u> to be done*. MDM
 - 1. Scholars study for the sake of information, soldiers study for mission.
 - a) Slide8b We don't want to study this only for *what God did* but for what *He still wants to do*.
 - 2. We're invited in, to the most important mission of the world.
- B. Slide8c I love the intro in my old Bible (Broadman & Holman), The book of Acts is the story of the men and women who took that commission seriously and began to spread the news of a risen Savior to the most remote corners of the known world.
 - 1. We get to go on a journey together. We get to watch this *slow burning gospel fire* sweep across the known world, from Jerusalem to Rome.
- C. Slide8d The book of Acts is simply *history written with a purpose*.
 - It's the birth & development of the early church. It's the coming of the HS. It's the gifts of the Spirit being worked out. It shows the apostolic authority. It introduces persecution & martyrdom. It's about world missions. It's about grace vs law. It's about bold gospel preaching. It's about walls of racial & religious pride being dealt with. And we have Jesus' last words to us in 1:8.

- D. Some spiritual movements started with God using **popular individuals**, some with the **average Christian business men**, some with folks getting together & pleading/**praying for revival**; **Slide8e** but each were *a deliberate, intentional, purposeful moving of the Holy Spirit*.
 - 1. No person set out to create the Church. The Holy Spirit birthed it right into the very soul of His people.
- E. Slide9a Acts is written by Luke. It's Volume 2, in a 2-part work. Acts is the Sequel to which Luke is the Prequel.
 - 1. Slide9b Luke ended with Jesus' ascension, And he led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God.
 - a) The reader is compelled to say...*but then what?* Luke answers that question for us in his sequel. He proceeds to tell us the exciting story of the coming of the Holy Spirit, who is the Promise of the Father, and the exciting birth of the early church.
 - Slide10a Luke wrote in the early 60's AD. As he ended Acts w/Paul still awaiting trial in prison. And the Emperor Nero had not yet turned against the Christians, 64ad.
 - 3. Luke was a close friend & traveling companion of Paul.
 - 4. Many believe Luke wrote both Luke & Acts while in Rome w/Paul.
 - a) Paul wrote in 2nd Timothy, only Luke is with me. 2 Tim.4:11
- F. We know Luke was a Gentile & a Physician.
 - 1. A writing in the 2nd century states, that Luke was a native of Antioch, Syria. Never married. Died in Boeotia/*Bee-O-Sha* Ancient Greece, at the age of 84.
- G. Slide10b Gospel of Luke is the *longest* single book in the NT. Luke & Acts constitute 28% of the NT, making Luke the most prolific of its contributors. [2,138 verses vs. Paul who wrote 2,033]
 - 1. It is also written in the moist refined Greek in the NT, giving it unsurpassed literary richness & beauty.

- Also the book of Acts begins where each of the 4 gospels left off.
 [Mt great commission. Mrk confirming the Word thru accompanying signs.
 Luke the ascension. John testimony is true]
- H. Slide11 Acts records the *acts* of Peter (ch's.1-12) & the *acts* of Paul (ch's.13-28).
 - Peter used the keys to open the door of faith to the Jews (2), the Samaritans (8), & the Gentiles (10).
 - 2. Paul took the good news to the Gentiles in the Roman Empire.
 - a) We start in *Jerusalem*, capital of the <u>Jews</u> & end in *Rome* the capital of the <u>Gentiles</u>.
- Slide12a Some say a good title would be: *The Acts of Jesus*. Or *The Acts of the HS*. Or *The Acts of the Apostles* (as it's not exhaustive). Others say the best title would be *The Acts of the Holy Spirit through the church*.
 - 1. It's a record of some specific acts chosen by the Holy Spirit to be recorded, to reveal to us His power, to show us how He worked in the early church.
 - 2. Slide12b Swindoll, Acts is a *travelogue*, as we watch Christianity, from Jerusalem, to Syria, to Turkey, across the Mediterranean to Greece, & finally to Rome, Italy.
 - 3. This book then is for every Christian who wants to experience the power of the Holy Spirit & be a witness (39 x's) for Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth
 - 4. Do you want to experience the power of the Holy Spirit in your life?
 - 5. Do you want to experience the **boldness** of the **Holy Spirit** in your life?
 - 6. What part does God want you to play in taking the good news to the world?
 - a) It simply starts with 1 question from Paul used in 9:6 nkjv *Lord, what do You want me to do?*
- J. Slide13 We can break Acts down into **3 sections**: Ch.'s 1-7. 8-12. 13-28.
 - Each focus in on: a particular audience, a key personality, & a significant phase in the expansion of the gospel message. [*ie* Jerusalem. Judea & Samaria. end of the known earth] So Acts 1:8 really outlines the book.
 - 2. Note: Each expansion was brought on by *persecution*.
 - a) But they were able to watch the gospel message penetrate *geographical, social, racial, & religious* barriers.

b) Acts is about the 1st 30 years of the church, as God used ordinary people to do extraordinary things.

III. Slide14a THE CONTINUING ACTS OF JESUS (1-3) Read vss.1-8

- A. Luke really says a lot in his intro about: Jesus. Do & Teach. Ascension. HS. Apostleship. Chosen. Resurrection. Jesus' suffering. Witness/proof. The kingdom of God. Baptism of the HS.
- B. Slide14b (1) Do & teach Don't you just love the order?
 - 1. May we not just be known for our sayings, but of both our sayings & doings.
 - 2. And, may it be said that our doings did not clash with our sayings.
- C. Slide14c Jesus began both to do & teach (in gospel of Luke) Acts is an account of *the continuation* of Jesus' work, **through** the Holy Spirit, **in** the early church.
- D. (3) Many infallible proofs The word *proofs* occurs <u>only</u> here in the NT, and looks at *clearly apparent evidence* in contrast with evidence provided by witnesses.
 - 1. In other words, the resurrected Lord was proven by sight, touch, hearing.
 - 2. Luke 24:39 *Look* at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! **Touch** me and **see**; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you **see** I have.
 - 3. 1 John 1:1 That which was from the beginning, which we have **heard**, which we have **seen** with our eyes, which we have **looked at** and our hands have **touched** this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.
- E. 40 days Luke might be comparing the disciples' time learning from Jesus after His ascension to Moses' time learning from God on Mount Sinai, see Exod 24:18.
- F. Slide14d 40 days of Kingdom of God teaching Why He sick around for 40 days?
 - 1. Jesus kingdom is not political or geographic in the sense that nations and kingdoms are thought of today. Instead, it exists *wherever God's will is done*.
 - 2. It is the effective reign of God expressed **in** and **through** the lives and actions of **His people**.
 - 3. God's kingdom *via the Messiah* also deals with sin, which is the world's fundamental problem.

- G. Slide15 Questions to Ponder: Think, dream & ponder with me on these.
 - 1. What is God going to do in/with **CM** by going through this book?
 - 2. What is God going to do in/with me by going through this book?
 - 3. How do we, or how should we evaluate/assess if the Spirit is working in us?
 - 4. Is our God limited to moving how He did during the last movement, *Jesus Movement*?
 - 5. Is it about us experiencing something, or the world experiencing Him?
 - 6. Would we be satisfied with *a world won for Christ* & *the Father blessed with worshipers*...or do <u>we</u> need <u>more</u>?
 - 7. What if God wanted to emphasize only *the boldness of faith* in this next spiritual awakening...would we be ok with that?
 - 8. <u>What</u> will the next Jesus movement look like? <u>How</u> will it be different? <u>Who</u> will He use?
 - a) Look what it changed last time: Youth came back to church. The music style completely changed. The spotlight became what was on the inside not on what you wore to church. It focused once again on the Essentials of *The Book* & not the opinions of the Majority. It took a total different direction then the direction the mainstream church was going at the time.
- H. Will you offer yourself to pray for, to be used in, & to be open to HIS next move? (remember: moving is changing & changing is growing)
 - In 2020 Growing Faith <u>lives</u> each day with eternity in view.
 In 2020 Growing Faith isn't afraid to <u>embrace</u> a vision greater than oneself.
 In 2020 Growing Faith isn't afraid to <u>take on</u> a God sized assignment.
 In 2020 Growing Faith <u>invests</u> in the most important things...*people*.
- Slide16 Are we willing to accept God's mission, as our mission? *Warning!* It will cost you. *Warning!* It will cost us...only everything.
