Acts 18:1-17 10-11-20

#### **Corinth**

#### I. Slide1 Announce:

- A. Slide2-5 Lar/AL Calvary Kids. Welcome online. Family Movie Night. Children at Risk. A21 Global Freedom Summit. Update Food Drive show totals.
- B. Slide6,7 Update Rohingya Bibles \$3000 towards \$4000.
- C. Slide8 Wed Night series We are transitioning from our *Identity in Christ* series to *The Importance of Community*. Consider that God not only gives us an identity, but He also places us in a community. Why? Because *only in community* can we practice our Christlike identity (think *one another* scriptures). *Maker of Community*.
- D. Prayer: May this outside place, be our space, where we come together to connect & communicate with You Father....who are in heaven, but also in Murrieta, rt now!

#### II. Slide9 Intro:

- A. Paul now moves from the *intellectual* center of **Athens** to the *commercial* center of **Corinth** 
  - 1. 10,000 lived in Athens, about 3/4 of a million lived in Corinth at its zenith.

# III. CORINTH (1) Corinth

- A. Corinth was a world famous emporium.
- B. Slide 10/11 In Greece, in the province of Achaia, an *isthmus* (*ismes*) joined Greece's mainland to the Peloponnesian peninsula, thus giving it 2 Ports.
- C. Slide12 It commanded trade routes in all directions. Before the Corinthian canal was cut for 3 1/2 miles across the isthmus, there was a *diolkos* or slipway along which cargoes & even small vessels could be pulled using *channels* (saving 200 miles of perilous navigation to go around the peninsula).
  - 1. Because of these **2 harbors**, the city of Corinth was a city of *seafarers* & *maritime merchants*.
  - 2. Hardly surprising that Poseidon (Gk *god of the sea*...Romans called *Neptune*) was worshipped there.

- 3. The markets would have been stocked with: *Arabian balsam, Egyptian papyrus, Phoenician dates, Libyan ivory, Babylonian carpets, Cilician goats'-hair, Lycaonian wool, Phrygian slaves'.* F. W. Farrar, pg.315.
  - a) But what Paul's thinking was...if trade could radiate from Corinth in all directions, so could the gospel.:)
- D. When **the church** gets planted here it's not w/o problems. Some have called **1st** Corinth's, *A People in Process*, or *A Bride in Rehab*.
  - 1. In 1 Cor. we find: Divisions, difficulties, factions, lawsuits, immorality, questionable practices, abuse of the spiritual gifts, even abuse of the Lords Supper.
- E. Q: Who do you think of when you hear, *dynamic dou*? tell your neighbor

  IV. Slide13a AQUILA & PRISCILLA (2-11) *dynamic duo* [mac-n-cheese. HS & you]
  - A. As we are starting *Importance of Community*. Community at its root means *common*: A feeling of fellowship with others, as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals. Thus Paul connects with someone from his own trade.
    - 1. Tentmakers *cloth/leather worker* a course fabric from thick goats hair of his native Cilicia. [They made curtains, rugs, clothing, as well as tents from it]
  - B. Slide13b Aquila & Priscilla originally lived in Rome. Were banished. Went to Corinth (where they met Paul). Next followed Paul to Ephesus. Lastly back to Rome.
    - 1. In church history, we don't hear of any <u>church buildings</u> until the *3rd century*. The little congregations met in *private homes*.
    - 2. We know Aquila & Priscilla had a church in their home in both **Rome** & in **Ephesus**.
    - 3. They seemed to always make their home *a center* of Christian **light** & **love**. [Their home was a haven of rest, peace, friendship]
  - C. Home fellowships, Community Groups, Support or Critical Care groups, Men's or Women's groups...these are like *mini-churches*.

- It is one of the best ways to grow in your Christianity (can ask questions).
   One of the best accountability's. And brings about fellowship (if you're really getting to know other believers).
- 2. Ever think of **attending** one? Ever think of **starting** one? Ever think of **Hosting** one, **teaching** one, **watching children** for one?

## V. Slide14a **GALLIO** (12-17)

- A. (12) An inscription at *the Temple of Apollo* in Delphi indicates that Gallio's time in Corinth can be dated to ad 51-53.
- B. (12-17) Gallio Not *Gamaliel* (Paul studied under). Not *Galileo* (the Italian Astronomer that Fredy Mercury sang about in *Bohemian Rhapsody*)
  - 1. Gallio was a Roman authority in Achaia. (akai/EE/a)
  - 2. Elder brother of **Seneca** (famous *philosopher*. *Tutor* of Emperor Nero)
- C. Slide14b Here's what just happened in this section. (unprecedented, Historic decision)
  - 1. The Jews are forcing Rome's hand in regards to the imperial cult.
  - 2. By the time Christianity arrived, the Roman Empire had begun to **deify** its **human emperors**.
    - a) All Roman citizens were required by law to participate in the **festivals** & ceremonies that would honor them as **gods**.
  - 3. This **becomes** a serious problem, from the end of the 1st century, to Constantine in the 4th century.
    - a) For 200 yrs the Roman gov was responsible for some of the most indescribable atrocities against Christians ever recorded.
  - 4. Slide14c But this wasn't a problem yet. Why not? Jews, like Christians, also worshiped only 1 God. The Romans had recognized this & had declared <u>Judaism</u> a religio licita (lisita=allowed), Latin for a legal religion.
  - 5. Thus Jews were exempted from the requirements. When Christianity came along, it began a *Messianic Judaism* (a **branch** of Judaism)
    - a) Here in Corinth the Jewish leaders tried to draw the line, & declare Christianity shouldn't be considered a part of Judaism.

- b) If they could only get it declared *religio illicita*. (an illicit religion)
- 6. Gallio couldn't understand *theological* nuances, like most of us today couldn't analyze the differences between **Sunni** & **Shiite Muslims**.
- 7. For the next 10-12 years, until **imperial** policy toward Christians underwent a complete **reversal** (they remained free to share the gospel).

### VI.Slide15a JESUS (9,10) Jesus always wrote in red:)

- A.(9,10) Paul had a lot of reasons to be **encouraged**: Priscilla & Aquila, Silas & Tim, financial help, a full-time ministry, encouraging results.
  - 1. But in the midst of this, he fell prey to *fear and discouragement*. Fear seems to do it's best haunting at night. What are <u>your</u> late night fears telling <u>you</u>? In which <u>area</u> of your life do you need to hear, *do not be afraid*?
- B. Slide15b Do Not Be Afraid (9a) do not be afraid
  - 1. Paul was afraid. Why? people just got saved/baptized. This seems a little random, but 1st Corinthians fill sin some blanks for us.
    - a) Slide15c/d He wrote in 1 Cor.2:2,3, I resolve to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. I came to you and weakness and fear, and with much trembling.
    - b) Slide15e It was surely the **pride** and **immorality** of the Corinthian people which intimidated Paul, since the cross comes into *direct collision with both*.
  - 2. The Corinthians were a **proud** people.
    - a) They manifested intellectual arrogance. They were proud of **their city**. They boasted of its **wealth** and **culture**. Of the world-famous **Isthmian games**. And of its **political prestige** as the capital of provincial Achaia.
    - b) But **the cross** undermines *all human pride*. It insists that we sinners have absolutely nothing with which to **buy**, or indeed **contribute to**, our salvation.
  - 3. Corinth was associated in everybody's mind with **immorality**.

- a) Behind the city, nearly 2,000 feet above sea level, rose the rocky eminence called the **Acro-corinth**. On its flat summit stood the temple of **Aphrodite** the goddess of love.
  - (1) Where 1000 female slaves served her and roamed the city's streets by night as prostitutes.
  - (2) The sexual promiscuity of Corinth was proverbial, so that *korinthiazomai* meant to practice immorality, and *korinthiastēs* was a synonym for a harlot.
- b) The gospel of *Christ crucified* summoned the Corinthians to **repentance** and **holiness**, and warned them that *the sexually immoral would not inherit the kingdom of God*.
- c) It is in these ways that *Christ's cross*, in its call for self-humbling and self-denial, is a *stumbling-block* to the proud and the sinful.

### C. Slide15f Keep Ministering (9b) go on speaking and do not be silent

- 1. Think of this... **Weakness** is the secret strength of God's most effective servants. Kent Hughes
  - a) If you're feeling weak, if you're feeling fearful...rely on Him & His power to be made perfect in your weakness. Then all the glory will go to Him.

## D. Slide15g Receive His With Promise (10a) I am with you

- 1. Here Paul is *fortified* by the presence & protection of Christ.
- 2. Hildebert of Lavardin: God is **over** all things; **outside** all; **within** but not enclosed; **without** but not excluded; **above** but not raised up; **below** but not depressed; holy **above** presiding; holy **beneath** sustaining; wholly **within**, filling.
- 3. *I am with you* the promise God gave to **Isaac**, **Jacob**, the **Jewish remnant** returning from Babylon, **Jeremiah**, the **Jews** rebuilding the temple. And Jesus gave to **us**. (Mt.28:20).

- a) Where do you need the truth that *He is here* inscribed on your life?
- E. Slide15h Recognize Your Work Will Not Be in Vain (10c) I have many in this city who are my people
  - 1. Paul's work would not be fruitless. According to Paul's *other writings* this <u>fruit</u> would include: *Erastus, Gaius, Stephanos, Fortunatus, and Achaicus*.
- F. Note that I left out (10c)...no one will attack you to harm you. Paul wasn't promised this before or after Corinth, & I can't promise you no one will attack you to harm you.
- G.So don't be afraid. Stop borrowing trouble. Look to me, I love you. Keep ministering. Keep caring. Keep speaking my name. Believe that I am with you and I will protect you when I believe you need it. Believe that your Life will bear fruit, I promise.
- H. Slide16 According to an ancient story, when Leonidas (think *Gerard Butler*/300), the noble hero of the **Spartans** who defended **Greece** from the **Persians**, was in battle against thousands of invaders, one of his men said to him, General, "when the *Persians shoot their arrows, there are so many of them that they darken the sky.*" Leonides replied, "Then we will fight in the shade."
  - 1. Paul continued **serving** the Lord and **fighting** the battle, **regardless** of his **feelings**, no matter what **circumstances** he saw on the horizon.
  - 2. We must do the same. No matter how our <u>elections</u> turn out. No matter how the <u>Coronavirus</u> turns out. *Then we will fight in the shade!* 
    - a) You probably think 2020 is the worst year. But, turns out, it's not.

      A volcanic eruption in Iceland in early 536 led to incredibly large quantities of ash being spread across much of the globe, plunging *Europe*, *Africa and Asia* into darkness 24 hours a day, for nearly 2 years. This eruption was so immense that it altered the global climate and adversely affected weather patterns and caused crops to fail, creating mass starvation. This resulted in the coldest decade (the dark ages) in 2,000 years and was accompanied by the bubonic plague which killed over 100 million and almost half of the Byzantine Empire. *Then we will fight in the shade!*
