Spiritual Rip Van Winkles

I. Slide1 Announce:

- A. Slide2-6 Larry: Sun Nt Prayer. Sun 9AM service. Helpers CK. Laster's. Turkey's.
- B. Slide7 Wed Night: *Multiplying of Community*. AP [*embracing* other sheep into this fold...including others. Whether a <u>neighbor</u> across the street or someone much different from us across the seas]
- C. Prayer: What a prayer we sang this morning asking God to bless our America, land that we love. Asking God to <u>stand beside</u> her and <u>guide</u> her, through the night <u>with a light from above</u>. God we need <u>Your light</u> during these <u>dark times</u>... [Irving Berlin]

II. Slide8 Intro: Spiritual Rip Van Winkles

- A. It is foolish for Christians to want to *go back* to the book of Acts and model today's church after it. The book of acts was a transitional period. It was an *incomplete church* where there was no complete Bible, and no definitive doctrines. That's why there were little pockets of people like Apollos and these Ephesian *disciples* with inadequate theology. Everything was in transition. *Donald Grey Barnhouse, Acts, pg173*.
 - 1 *Read Acts 19:1-10
- B. Slide9 1st Illustration: During the latter part of the 18th century many colonist left Virginia and started through the mountains to settle the valleys that lay far to the west. Fear of Indians, the death of a horse, or the breaking down of a wagon forced many to stay in the mountains. For over 20 years the settlers sign a white man at all, until a group of travelers struggled into their area. Naturally there was much conversation about the outside world. The travelers ask the mountaineers what they thought of the new republic and the policies of the continental Congress. The others answered, we have not so much as heard of a Continental Congress or a Republic. They thought of themselves as a loyal subjects of the British king and *had not even heard of* George Washington or the revolutionary war. Donald GrayBarnhouse, pg.159,160.
- C. Slide10 2nd Illustration: The story of Rip Van Winkle was about a *Dutch-American villager* in colonial America who meets a mysterious Dutchmen, drinks

their liquor and falls asleep in the *Catskill Mountains*. He awakes 20 years later to a very changed world, having missed the American Revolution.

- 1. Slide11 Now picture a group of men at a *Passover* making the long trek from Ephesus to Jerusalem. They meet *John the Baptist*, they even get baptized by him. And they return home. But as soon as they home, they're *isolated*. *No newspapers*, *no telephones*, *no radio*, *very rarely would news reach that area*, *especially about a rogue Messiah from Jerusalem*.
- 2. They would've heard of Jesus when they were in Jerusalem, but didn't know the story behind *His birth, life, teaching, death, and ascension of the God-man, who gives the Holy Spirit to those who believe.*

III. Slide12,13 SPIRITUAL RIP VAN WINKLES (1-7)

- A. Ephesus is in *Asia* which Paul was previously forbidden...now right timing.
 - 1. Quick Stats: 4th largest city in Roman Empire. Population ½ million. Elegant architecture. Temple of Artemis 1 of the 7 Wonders of the ancient world. And a principle center for magic for the ancient world (Magic, defined as, any process by which human beings become able to manipulate supernatural power for their own ends). [Paul will spend 3 yrs here]
- B. Slide14 These disciples were of *John-the-baptists* baptism thus John's disciples.
- C. We have not so much as heard whether the HS *has been given*. (NIV)
 - 1. John taught *his disciples* in Jn.1:33, He who sent me to **baptize with** water said to me, Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who **baptizes with the Holy Spirit**.
- D. In the name of... was the issue.
 - 1. **John's** baptism was *in the name of* repentance, awaiting Messiah.
 - 2. Jesus' baptism was in the name of the Lord Jesus. (aka believers baptism)
 - a) Praise God these guys were open. They simply were operating on old marching orders. They hadn't gotten the memo on Jesus. And they didn't cop an attitude, "no thanks, we've got our John religion going." Or, "we've believe this for 30 years now...". Nope. They said, Thanks we're in!

- b) They simply had a few *holes* in their cup of Christian doctrine.
- E. Do you have <u>all</u> of these covered? What baptism did <u>you</u> receive? Make sure you've received *ALL* that God has to offer you.
 - Slide15 Million \$ question: Are you living today as if Pentecost had never taken place? Luke 11:13 If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him.
- F. *Response*: speaking in tongues & prophesying... *a mini-pentecost* showing <u>true</u> <u>change</u>. Not normative throughout Acts. But is the norm *when the gospel breaks into a new group*. (ch.2 w/Jews at Pent; ch.8 w/Samaritans; ch.10 w/1st Gentiles; ch.19 rest of Gentiles)
- G. Slide16 There are 5 verbs in the Bible in connection w/the work of the Holy Spirit.
 - 1. We are **born** of the Spirit into the <u>family</u> of God. (Jn.3:6,8)
 - 2. We are **baptized** of the Spirit into the <u>body</u> of Christ. (1Cor.12:13)
 - 3. We are *in-dwelt* by the Holy Spirit as He comes to <u>live in us</u>. (Rom.8:9)
 - We are sealed with the Holy Spirit unto the day of redemption. (Eph.1:13; 4:30) [these 4 works of the HS are simultaneous & instantaneous, for anyone who is truly trusting in Christ]
 - 5. Then there is the *filling* of the Holy Spirit (Eph.5:18) that happens *again* & *again* in the life of the believer.

IV. Slide17a SPIRITUAL TRAINING IN EPHESUS (8-10)

- A. Paul demonstrates *flexibility of method* & rents a lecture hall of a pagan philosopher
 - 3 months in synagogue, then 2 years in Tyrannus' school daily.
 [Tyrant, no parent would call their <u>baby</u> this...a <u>toddler</u> yes! Prob students nicknames him this]
 - 2. Western text of the Greek NT tells us that Paul taught from the 5th to the 10th hour. (or from, 11am to 4pm every day)
 - 3. The Ephesians kept a **strict siesta** during this time.

- a) William Ramsey said (archaeologist/NT scholar), *Public life in the Ionian cities* ended regularly at the 5th hour (11am).
- b) One historian reportedly commented, that more people in Ephesus were asleep at 1pm than at 1am.
- B. Here is the clearest example of formalized leadership training in the NT.
 - 1. Obviously different from ordinary teaching in **house churches**, or even teaching in the **synagogues**.
 - 2. These men would give up their *lunch-time*, *nap-time*, even their *soap* opera's in order to train.
 - 3. Paul wrote 1st Cor. while he was here.
- C. What training have you had? Self taught? Sunday morning taught? Sun & wed night taught? Home Study taught? Radio/Podcasts taught? Bible College? Seminary?
- D. Slide17b (8) I would like to end w/some practical thoughts of reason and *hopefully* persuade <u>us</u> to remember *the kingdom of God* in 2020, as Paul did here in ad52. [Paul here is talking about *a heavenly kingdom* while living in an earthly kingdom]
 - If Paul was peaching about the kingdom of God then he was preaching about Jesus the King.
 - 2. Did you know that over the last 2000 years, whenever the church has succeeded in gaining political power it has been *disastrous* both for the **church** and the **culture**.
 - 3. Did you know that over the last 2000 years, whenever the church has picked up the **sword**, it ended up laying down the **cross**?
 - 4. Did you know that the church was established to **serve** the world with *Christ-like love*, not to **rule over** the world?
 - 5. Did you know that those who not only <u>believe</u> like Jesus but also <u>live</u> like Jesus, have no sides nor enemies, but we are called to embrace and accept and love <u>everyone</u> (as Jesus did those who reviled or crucified him. Think: thief & centurion)

- 6. Believers, yes alot is at stake this election. But please do not *polarize or lose* family members, or friends, or church friends, or your witness, over <u>your</u> political bias. Love is <u>patient</u> and <u>kind</u>. Love is <u>not jealous</u> or <u>boastful</u> or <u>proud</u> or <u>rude</u>. It <u>does not demand</u> its own way. It is <u>not irritable</u>.
- 7. I'm asking us...Can **we** be even more impassioned about *the kingdom of the God you serve*, more than you are, *the kingdom of* this world?
- E. Wrap up: there are 3 kinds of people in our church: <u>non-Christians</u>, <u>committed Christians</u>, <u>and Christians who used to believe</u>. (Kent Hughes, pg.251,252)
 - 1. Non-Christians individuals who have not received Christ or the HS, though they may have some degree of intellectual belief. They may even have a desire to repent, but they have not yet met the resurrected Christ.
 - 2. Committed Christians who need to keep on believing and keep on receiving the Holy Spirit's *grace and power and filling*.
 - 3. Christians who used to believe this group needs the same advice given by Jesus to the church of the Ephesians when they *left their first love*, *Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. Remember Repent Return.*

F Communion:

- 1. You've heard, The ground is level at the foot of the cross [meaning, there is none too good to need Jesus, none too sinful to be saved]
- 2. Communion is similar for all believers. It's a leveler.
 - a) Jesus invites this morning strong believers & stumbling believers to His table.
 - b) He invites *democrat believers*, *republican believers* & *other political party believers* to His table.
 - c) He invites believers of every ethnicity & every race to His table.
 - d) He invites *believers* to come & dine with him. To experience cleansing and wholeness. Sin washed away & shame chased away. To come face-to-face

with your God. To know forgiveness & feel His peace. To be bathed in His companionship & drenched in His love.

3. 1) We come out of **obedience**. 2) We come as a **gathered family**.
3) We come in this **physical act** of a simple meal, eating bread & drinking the cup. 4) We come with a **mental act** of remembering how Jesus lived and died and rose for us. 5) And we come at an even deeper level than remembering, *The bread we break is it not a participation in the body of Christ?* Literally, we are sharing his body and blood. We are experiencing a **partnership** in his death. 6) And we come with a **sacred seriousness**.
