Revelation 5

Worship The Lamb-Like Lion & the Lion-Like Lamb

- I. Slide1,2 Intro:
 - A. We continue John's *throne room vision & private guided tour*.
 - 1. He records what he sees & hears. Auditory/visual experience. Slide3a/b [*I looked* 12 x's, *I saw* 24x's, *I heard* 26 x's]
 - 2. Heaven (532 x's) *a real place* that John is experiencing with all his senses.
 - B. Slide3c/d Worship (last vs.) = to ascribe Worth. *Worship means, To use all that we are & have, to Praise God for all that He is & does.* Warren Wiersbe
 - C. Worship is also Wonder. Thomas Carlyle said, *Wonder* is the basis of worship.
 - 1. Wonder is a priceless ingredient in the life of any thinking person.
 - D. In ch.4 we talked about Worship of the Father. Now the spot light moves to the Lamb.
 - 1. Drawing every eye & prompting endless Praise.
 - 2. Why would they do this in the sight of God the Father if Jesus was not God?

II. Slide4 THE QUESTION (1,2)

- A. One question, in vs.2 *who is worthy to open the scroll & to loose its seals?* In which the rest of the chapter answers the question.
- B. Slide5a Explain scroll Papyrus, rolled w/7 seals (bound books didn't exist yet. broken open 1x1)
- C. Did you know *seals* go back to **4th millennium bc**?
 - 1. One document that was sealed w/7 seals, back in John's day, was a *Last Will and Testament* (or a testators wishes).
 - 2. Under Roman law, 7 witnesses to a Will sealed it w/their seals (sealed w/wax, along 1 edge). And it only could be opened w/all 7, *or* their representatives.
 - a) This was the case with both Caesar Augustus & Emperor Vespasian.
 - b) Such a document was sealed with **wax** or **clay** & could be opened only by a qualified person(s).
- D. Slide5b (2) The issue wasn't finding someone willing.

- 1. Many a men were <u>willing</u> to rule the earth: Alexander the Great, Genghis Khan, Napoleon, Hitler. The issue wasn't who was willing but who was Worthy.
- 2. We hear no other voice speak up in heaven...*Here, give me that scroll*...not Abraham, not Moses, not Peter, not even Mary.

III. Slide6 THE LAMB-LIKE LION & THE LION-LIKE LAMB (3-7) [John Piper sermon, 1986]

- A. Only the **Lion** from *the Tribe of Judah* has *the moral right* to open the scroll which will reveal & bring about history's completion.
 - 1. Many call this Scroll: Gods *Will*, His *final settlement* of the affairs of the universe, the *Title Deed* to creation.
 - 2. From what's written on the scroll (in ch.6) it's obvious the **subject** of the scroll is regarding *the sphere of man*.
 - 3. The right to rule the earth is about to be declared at the Throne of God, once & for All.

B. Slide7a A *LAMB-LIKE* LION (5)

- C. Lion, an animal who *makes prey of others* and that is **strong** and **wild** and **majestic** and **dangerous**. Jesus as lion speaks of: *Dignity, Sovereignty, Courage, Victory*.
- D. The Lion of Judah *conquered/prevailed* because he was willing to *act the part of a Lamb*.
 - 1. He came into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday like a King on the way to a throne, and he went out of Jerusalem on Good Friday like a Lamb on the way to the slaughter.
 - He drove out the robbers from the Temple like a Lion devouring its prey.
 And then at the end of the week He gave His majestic neck to the knife.
 And they slaughtered the Lion of Judah like a Lamb.
 - 3. So he conquered *sin and death and Satan* not just because He was a Lion, but because he was *a Lamb-like Lion*.

E. Slide7b THE LION-LIKE LAMB

1. Only through *His sacrificial atonement* is our future w/God even possible.

- When John turned around to see the Lion, he saw a Lamb. Not an animal who makes prey of others but is prey himself. An animal that is easily preyed upon and that is weak and harmless and lowly, sheared for our <u>clothes</u> and killed for our <u>food</u>.
 - a) (Piper) Because Jesus is a *Lion-like Lamb* and *a Lamb-like Lion*, He has the right to bring the world to an end for the glory of His name and the good of His people.
- F. Notice 2 things:
 - 1. Notice that the Lamb is *standing*. It is not slumped in a heap on the ground as it once was. It *had been* slain. But now it is *standing* standing in the innermost circle next to the throne.
 - 2. Notice that the Lamb has 7 horns (horn is a symbol of **strength** and **power** throughout the book of Revelation as well as in the OT). And the number 7 signifies **fullness** and **completeness**.
- G. This is no ordinary Lamb. He is *a Lion-like Lamb*.
 - Look at 6:16 where men call to the mountains and rocks, *Fall on us and <u>hide</u> <u>us from</u> the face of him who is <u>seated</u> on the throne (Father), and from the wrath of the Lamb (Jesus). [Lamb wrath? or Lambo]*
 - 2. And look at 17:14 where the final enemies of God fight against Christ: *they will make war on the Lamb, and the Lamb will conquer them, for He is Lord of lords and King of kings.*
- H. As though it had been Slain...(i.e.) He still had the *markings* [maybe to remind man for all eternity of *the cost* of their redemption]
 - 1. Yet, He was standing...meaning Victorious!
 - 2. The emphasis then is on His resurrection not on the crucifixion... Had been slain
 - 3. Remember, Jesus is called Lamb 29 x's in the book of Rev.
- I. Slide8 So both Lamb & Lion representing 2 aspects of Jesus 'nature: the Royal & the Sacrificial:
 - 1. As Lamb He offers salvation [Sacrificial]
 - 2. As Lion He judges those who reject Him [Royal]
- J. Slide9 Not the progression of the Lamb in Scripture:

- 1. The OT question from *Isaac* was, *Where is the Lamb?*
- 2. The NT answer from John the Baptist was, Behold the Lamb of God!
- 3. The Choirs in Heaven will sing, Worthy is the Lamb!
- K. (7) Satan *offered* Jesus the whole world in return for *one act of worship* (Mt.4:8-10), but Jesus *won* the right to receive the scroll when He *gave Himself* on the cross.

IV. Slide10 WORTHY (8-14)

- A. (8) Incense represents prayer.
 - 1. Ps.141:2a NLT Accept my prayer as incense offered to you.
 - 2. If you ever thought your prayers don't matter, look at these **stored** here.
 - 3. The prayers of God's people play a vital part in God's governing of the world.
- B. Worthy He is worthy *not only because* He is **Creator** (4:11) but even more because he is our *Redeemer*.
- C. Slide11 A 5-fold new song:
 - 1. A Worship Song you are worthy.
 - 2. A Gospel Song you were slain...have redeemed...by your blood.
 - a) Interesting, Heaven sings about the Cross & the Blood, & yet some churches today have omitted all Hymns with this subject matter out of their hymn books.
 - 3. A Missionary song every tribe, tongue, people, nation.
 - a) Lifted from Daniel 7:13,14.
 - b) The church now serves as *Israel* once did, with the tasks of worshiping God & making Him known to the world.
 - c) What does this mean for *evangelism* that the Lamb *has purchased people* from every tribe, language, people, & nation?
 - 4. A Priestly song and have made us a kingdom of priests.
 - 5. A Prophetic song we shall reign on earth.
 - a) The future is to share Christ's rule on earth.
- D. (9) New song? It's 2000 years old!

- 1. New, not in time or origin; but new in the sense of its nature, something previously unknown & unprecedented.
- 2. Moses song in Ex.15 was a song of redemption from Egypt.
 - a) A new work of redemption calls for a new song!
 - b) Redeemed In 1776 Thomas Paine, American Revolution patriot and writer, wrote about the price of freedom: What we obtain too cheap, we esteem too lightly; 'tis dearness only that gives everything its value. Heaven knows how to put a proper price upon its goods; and it would be strange indeed, if so celestial an article as Freedom should not be highly rated.
- E. (12) Worthy times 7.
- F. (13) Note the 4 things. Plus it is to both receiving it...thus again proving Christ to be God
 - 1. Slide12a Athanasian Creed states, We worship one God in Trinity, & Trinity in Unity; neither confounding the Persons, nor dividing the Substance.
 - a) Slide12b Athanasius of Alexandria's (296-373) shield of the Trinity, a visual representation of the doctrine of the Trinity, derived from the Athanasian Creed. The Latin reads: "The Father is God, The Son is God, The Holy Spirit is God; God is the Father, God is the Son, God is the Holy Spirit; The Father is not the Son, The Son is not the Father, The Father is not the Holy Spirit, The Holy Spirit is not the Father, The Father is not the Holy Spirit is not the Son."
- G. Slide13a (13) The whole heaven explodes into praise. [The crescendo of worship]
- H. Notice how contagious, infectious, irresistible, & communicable true Worship is.
 - 1. From the 4 living creatures (4:8); to the 24 elders (4:10); to the multitudes in heaven (5:9,10); to every creature above, on, under the earth, in the sea (5:13)
 - a) Even the demonic world & unsaved humanity thus fulfilling Phil.2:9-11 every knee.
- I. Heaven is a place of worship, so get ready now to join in the praise.
 - 1. This isn't a duty, a *do we have to* thing.
 - 2. I think it's like what happens *automatically* to us when *a good song comes on* in a store, where it's hard not to tap your foot, whistle, or sing to.
- J. Slide13b A. W. Tozer said, *Worship* is to *feel* in your heart and *express* in some appropriate manner a *humbling* but *delightful sense* of admiring awe and astonished

wonder and overpowering love in the presence of that most ancient Mystery, that Majesty which <u>philosophers</u> call the First Cause, but which <u>we</u> call Our Father Which Are in *Heaven*.

- K. (14) We end with the 4 living Creatures getting a little Pentecostal on us...Amen!
 - Hearing this praise to Jesus as the *Redeemer*...do you find your heart saying Amen?
