I. Announce:

A. Slide 1 9-11 Remembered: How many were *NOT* at our church 18 years ago? How many went to NY after 9-11 with 1 of our teams? [share my story]

II. Slide2 Intro: Liar Liar Pants on Fire

- A. Abraham repeats the mistake he made in **Egypt** (Gen. 12). *Relapse*.
 - 1. Finding himself in the foreign territory of *Gerar*, he again claims that *Sarah is his sister* out of **fear** of personal harm.
 - 2. In both instances *God intervenes and protects Abraham*. Here, God intervenes by appearing to Abimelech, *the foreign king*, in **a dream**.
 - 3. Also, this is on the brink of Isaac's birth-story. Here, the very Promise is put in jeopardy...traded away for personal safety. *Derek Kidner*
 - a) If it's ever to be fulfilled (it will be next chapter), then we owe very little to man & very much to *the grace of God*.

III. Slide3a **DECEIVING** (1-7) xxxxxx

- A. THE DECEPTION (1,2)
- B. Abi/melech my father is king (could be a *title* rather than a proper name).
- C. (2) Took Sarah It is possible that the goal of Abimelech's *taking Sarah* in marriage would be to form an alliance with Abraham, a man of great wealth and reputation after the war described in ch.14. [In 21:22,23 Abimelech seeks *a friendly nonaggression agreement* with Abraham]
- D. Abraham, you already fell for this down in Egypt...again Abraham?
 - 1. Wait, Have you ever done the same **sin** twice? Have you ever struggled with the same **fear** twice? Multiple sins...oh yah, *guilty*!
 - 2. Abraham was still learning who God is. This is not the end of his story.

E. Slide3b THE DREAM (3-7)

- F. (3) God came to Abimelech in a dream by night Dreams are a common mode of *divine* communication in biblical and extrabiblical literature.
- G. (4) Lord Not Yahweh, but *adonay* is used the customary address to a divine being.
- H. (5) Integrity of my heart...innocence of my hands in Hebrew, Tom & Nic (sorta) (nickIyon)
 - 1. The Hebrew word *tom* (integrity) means *blameless or upright*.
 - 2. It's used when God commands Abraham to *walk before Him and be blameless* (17:1). But here it is *the foreign king*, Abimelech, who is *blameless* rather than Abraham.
- I. (6) Abimelech an example of when grace fell on the *unjust*.
 - 1. Slide3c Mt.5:45 He makes His **sun** rise on the <u>evil</u> and on the <u>good</u>, and sends **rain** on the <u>just</u> and on the <u>unjust</u>.
- J. (7) He is a prophet (*oh he is?*) Prophets were essentially spokespersons for and representatives of God. They exhorted people to be **loyal** and **obey** his commands lest judgment occur.
- K. He will pray for you God will accept Abraham's intercession since Abraham is His chosen representative.
 - 1. So Abimelech will need to return Sarah and treat Abraham well in order to receive any prayer of blessing.
- L. Do you think God ever stopped you from sinning? Thank Him for it.
- M. Think of sins you have done more than once... Thank Him for His forgiveness.

IV. Slide4a **DEFENDING** (8-13)

- A. PAINFUL QUESTION (8-10)
- B. (9,10) Abimelech *obedient to God* but *rightfully angry* with Abraham.
 - 1. *Adultery* was even written about on the Code of Hammurabi 1754bc, this Babylonian code found in ancient Mesopotamia.
- C. (9c) The end of vs.9 could be rendered simply '...things that are not done'. He had insulted the most elementary laws of *hospitality*.
- D. (10) What did you see? The man of faith starts walking by sight.

- E. God sometimes uses the *unsaved* to chasten the **saved**.
- F. Slide4b PITIFUL ANSWER (11-13) [a pattern of bad choices: facts (11), values (12), motives (13)]
- G. (11) I thought there is *no fear of God* at all in this place Abraham views Abimelech and his people as *lacking any sense of morality* that would come from belief in the 1 true God.
 - 1. Who comes to your mind thinking, "there is definitely not a spiritual bone in their body, they definitely are not moral"? [don't write anyone off]
 - 2. I Try to go the other way & think everyone is wired for "spiritual" things.
- H. (12) She is indeed my sister Sarah was Abraham's half-sister. Such marriages seems to have been culturally acceptable at this point in time in the ancient Near East. Despite later prohibitions under the law (Lev.18).
 - 1. Abraham might have been *the friend of God* but you don't see him teaching at any *Married Couples Retreats*.
- I. Fear-based decisions...we all make them. Fear-based Christianity.
 - 1. He lets fear of harm determine his decision. He's lead by fear.
 - 2. I will protect myself. I will take this into my own hands. I trust my *cleverness* over God's wisdom.
 - 3. How do we move from Fear to Courage. Not though *bravado*. When we look to Jesus for our strength.
- J. Slide4c Half-truths! Besides, she is indeed my sister.
 - 1. The 2nd enemy of honesty is telling half-truths. [a half truth is a whole lie]
 - 2. We are even told in our court rooms to "tell the whole truth, and nothing but the truth".
 - 3. This is why we have the word *perjury*: human beings have trouble telling the **truth** even when they say they are telling the **truth**.
 - 4. Half-truths avoid what is actually meant and live in *technicalities and portions* of truth. [faithless scheming]
 - a) These are *an enemy of honesty* and God hates them.

- b) Think about it...Satan (*who deceives the whole world*, Rev.12:9) is *the father of 1/2 truths*. He often mixes **truth** in with his **lies**. [eg. to Eve, *you will not surely die*]
- c) Can you imagine it saying, worshipping God in spirit and 1/2 truths?
 - (1) Worshipping God in **spirit** and **truth** is hard to do with only half the truth.
- 5. Wait, so if the **2nd enemy** of honesty is telling *half-truths...*what is the **1st enemy** of Honesty? Telling whole-lies..of course :)
- K. (13) Blame shift even to *the gods causing him to wander* (see Heb.) An early negotiation with Sarah regarding his fears. [and was successful getting **her** to <u>lie</u>, vs.5]
 - 1. When a marriage must be protected by a lie, the home is in danger. Warren Wiersbe
 - 2. Husbands ever encourage your wife to **lie** for you (taxes, earnings, *tell your family we're doing ok*) And vice-versa?
- L. Ever have to eat humble pie? Ever get rebuked by an unbeliever & they were fully right? M.Have justified white-lies or half-truths lately? confess them.
- N. Have you asked anyone to lie for you lately? confess them before God, later repent to them.
- O. Meditate on Mt.16:25 For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it.

V. Slide5 **DELIVERING** (14-18) returning Sarah

- A. (14) Abimelech showed Abraham the kind of grace and generosity that Abraham, who knew God, should have showed to him. David Jeremiah Bible Notes
 - Abraham profited from his deception. Oh I don't like when God blesses me when I know I shouldn't be. [Pharaoh had sent him away (ch.12), Abimelech said stay anywhere here that you want]
- B. Returned Sarah Sarah was placed in great jeopardy.
- C. (18) Must have been there long enough to notice, *no babies*. [eg. weird plane movie]
- D. Have you noticed God's Protecting Care of you lately?
- E. Wrap Up:
- F. Slide6a God's saving Grace.
