Deut 29 9-17-14

Can we unscrew the inscrutable?

I. Slide#1 Announce:

- A. Reasons to Rejoice starts tomorrow night. You can still sign up tomorrow night ladies. Acts. 7pm sanct.

II. Intro:

- A. Slide#2 Title: Can we unscrew the inscrutable? (impossible to understand)
 - 1. Slide#3 What do you do with mysteries in Scripture? What do you do with the biblical Gordian knots? When life itself doesn't make any sense? Nor the hand *you've been dealt*?
- B. This chapter we'll see God's reminder, He had redeemed them (from Egypt) and thus they were responsible to obey Him. If they **obeyed**, He would <u>bless</u>; if they **disobeyed**, He would <u>judge</u>.

III. Slide#4 COVENANT RENEWED (1-9)

- A. (1) Wraps up the last chapter...in the Hebrew text it is 28:69.
- B. (2) Starts his 4th address but doesn't address anything *new*, he just **reiterates** what has been said thus far.
- C. (4) To this *very* day suggests that Israel had not yet understood these saving events.
 - 1. Thus apart from *divine enlightening*, people always remain <u>insensitive</u> to God's work (Paul uses this text in Rom.11:8).
 - 2. This shows us though...if we are to be **faithful**, we need **spiritual renewal** for our eyes, ears, & hearts.
 - a) We need to see His hand at work, hear His word, & love Him with all our hearts.
- D. (5-8) For 40 years the people **saw** miracles & **heard** words, yet they did not perceive what God was doing.
 - 1. They saw His acts but did not understand His ways.
 - a) Ps.103:7 He made known His ways to Moses, His acts to the children of Israel.
 - 2. They had seen God defeat the **idols** in Egypt, yet they still had *idolatry* in their hearts.
 - a) What could have been *spiritual experiences* was only a series of historical events because they did not focus on the Lord.

IV. Slide#5 COVENANT REVIEWED (10-19)

A. (18,19) Moses warned that even *one person* could defile the whole nation.

- 1. No individual should *suppose* they would automatically receive the benefit of God's grace *simply by* living within the community of God's people. No, *not then*, back in the wilderness. No, *not today*, in in the midst of His church.
- 2. Think of 1 man Achon in Joshua 7, effected all Israel [Jericho, abstain from the cursed things, they're the Lord's] He didn't. At Ai 36 soldiers died. Hid Babylonian garments, 200 shekels of silver, wedge/gold, under his tent...saw/coveted/took]
 - a) Today, 1 family member can *embarrass/humiliate* his/her whole family.

V. Slide#6 COVENANTAL REBUKE (20-29)

- A. (29) The secret things of the Lord refer to future details that God had not revealed.
 - 1. Yet what He had revealed (e.g., future judgment for disobedience, future blessing for obedience, His requirements for holiness, etc.) was enough to encourage the Israelites to **follow** all the words of the Law.
 - a) So our goal is to **obey** what we know & not **pry** into what we do not know.
 - 2. Some of Gods secrets He *can* reveal though, if he wants to...
 - a) Remember when Neb had a dream & asked for his magicians/astrologers/sorcerers to both tell him the **dream** & its **interpretation**.
 - b) Dan.2:28 But there is a God in heaven who <u>reveals secrets</u>, and he has shown King Nebuchadnezzar what will happen in the future. Now I will tell you your dream and the visions you saw as you lay on your bed.
- B. Deut.29:29 The **secret** things belong to the Lord our God, but those things which are **revealed** belong to us and to our children forever.
 - 1. Was what He said not enough? Not good enough?
 - 2. What if He never said anything new/different?
 - 3. What if in Heaven Jesus just quoted what He already said?
 - 4. Could He have said anything better? Wouldn't He have then?
 - 5. Is there a stronger promise He could have given? A more endearing term for Himself?
 - 6. Does it get any better than...Our **Father** who are in heaven. Or, The Lord is my **Shepherd**. For God **so loved**. In Your presence is fullness of **joy**. **Abba**?
 - a) What else am I looking for?
- C. So Moses lays out 2 classes of realities: secret & revealed. [Awake My Heart, J. Sidlow Baxter pg.216]
 - 1. Evidently there are some things which we are not meant to know yet.
 - 2. Slide#7 The Word of God is as **wise** in its reservations as it is **wonderful** in its revelations.

- 3. Enough is **revealed** to make faith intelligent. Enough is **reserved** to give faith scope for development.
- 4. Let's admit it...despite the Biblical revelation, we are surrounded by many baffling mysteries.
 - a) Birth is a mystery. Life is a mystery. Personality is a mystery. Human experience is a mystery. *Death, the universe, satan, eternity, & God* is a mystery.
 - b) And other mysteries: Like, Why are there no 'B' batteries? If God sneezes, what should you say? Is it still illegal to park next to a fire hydrant, even if your car is on fire? If a bunch of cats jump on top of each other, is it still called a dog pile? Do Jewish vampires still avoid crosses? And other very important questions.
- 5. But breaking through *all the mysteries* we have the glorious transfiguring **fact**...the **fact** of Jesus Christ.
 - a) He is a certified historical fact; a supremely significant fact; & an experientially realized fact. He really came, lived, taught, died, rose, & will return again.
 - b) Slide#8An old Puritan said Never let what you don't know disturb your faith in what you do know
- 6. Also, when it comes to *wars, accidents, bereavements*, & a thousand other *paradoxical ironies*...let's offer *no cheap solution*, but admit that they are mysteries.
- D. God has kept back no truth that it is profitable for us to know about His counsels, but only that which it is good for us to be ignorant of.
- E. Also remember why revelation is given to us in the first place...To become doers. vs.29b.

VI. Slide#9 ROMANS 11

- A. Paul in Rom.11 concludes the same way, on the same subject (prophecies of the Jews rejection)
 - 1. Slide#10 Read vs.33-36
- B. Ch.9 Israel's Past Election; Ch.10 Israel's Present Rejection; Ch.11 Israel's Future Reception.
- C. Rom.11:1 Is Israel cast away?
- D. In eschatology, some have cast Israel away Using 10:12 as their argument...For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek.
 - 1. But there isn't a distinction in their sins nor salvation. But there still is a distinction nationally, as Paul speaks to in ch.11.
 - 2. Don't forget the **timing**...this is <u>after</u> the death & resurrection of Christ, & yet he's still talking about *the Nation* of Israel.
 - a) *Nationally* they have not been stirred into a giant Gentile blender.
- E. (33) He praises God's knowledge & wisdom, yet while at the same time saying they are *beyond human understanding*.
 - 1. It's unwise to try to, "**fathom** the unfathomable or **unscrew** the inscrutable (imp to understand)."

- F. Depth Things that are hidden in **deep myster**y, so deep that no human knowledge will ever reach it.
- G. Unsearchable & unfathomable (past finding out; beyond tracing out)
 - 1. Both are hunting terms: Unsearchable = indicates an animal that is *untrackable*. Unfathomable = describes one that is *undetectable*.
 - a) We can't track God's thoughts. And even if you could, it would probably be so foreign to us, that we wouldn't even recognize them.
- H. (34,35) 3 Questions that don't need answers:
 - 1. [1] Can anyone **explain** God? [2] Anyone smart enough to **tell Him what to do**? [3] Has anyone done God such a big favor that **God owes them** now? [Ps.50:10-12]
- I. We cannot explain <u>all</u> the purposes & plans of God, but we can **worship** & **praise Him** for <u>who</u> <u>**He** is</u>.
- J. (36) Of Him He is the source (or, *Origin*)
- K. Through Him He is the agent (or, *Channel*)
- L. To Him He is the goal (or, *Destiny*, All things consist for His Glory)
 - 1. The end result of all Bible study (studying doctrines) is Worship.

VII. Slide#11 PARABLES

- A. Slide#12 Jesus explained these mysteries in...Mt.13:10-17 Read
- B. Many have said it is a parable is an, "Earthly story w/a Heavenly meaning."
- C. The parables are both Mirrors & Windows: Mirrors as they help us see ourselves. Windows as they help us see life & God.
- D. How to Study parables?
 - 1. Context: Parable of the good Samaritan's context? [It stemmed from the Lawyers evasive question, "Who is my neighbor?"]
 - 2. Main Truth: What's the main message? [Prodigal Son, is that God <u>receives</u> & <u>forgives</u> sinners]. You can discover in this rich parable many sp. truths, but all of them relate in some way to that primary lesson.
 - 3. No Over Kill: It's not nec. to make everything mean something.
 - 4. Illustrates Doctrine, Doesn't Declare it: Parables are windows into the house, not the foundation stones. [example: you can't build the doctrine of **good works** from the parable of the sheep & goats]
 - 5. Ask God for Spiritual Perception: For all bible study, but especially imp. in dealing with the parables. [the disciples asked for help w/them]
- E. So, Can we unscrew the inscrutable? (impossible to understand) Only when He wants us to!:)
