Storm Clouds Over Israel

I. Slide1 Announce:

A. Slide2 Thanksgiving Eve Service: 6:30pm. outside.

II. Slide3 Intro: Storm Clouds Over Israel

- A. This is the beginning of 8th century BC. *Storm clouds are moving over Israel and Judah*. We'll see the rise of the mighty Assyrian Empire to the Northeast. We will witness the military & political weakness in both Israel and Judah who are at their lowest ebb. The great Elisha the prophet will die, and cast a long shadow over the future of God's people. [Shepherds Notes, *adapted*]
- B. Slide4 A friend shared with me *theBibleProject.com* which takes each of the books of the bible & does a 5-8min overview. Let's watch 1 & 2 Kings.

III. Slide5 2 KINGS (1-13) Jehoahaz Israel & JehoashakaJoash Judah

- A. (3,4) Marry vs.3 with vs.4? He <u>heard</u> the prayer of the King, in spite of all the <u>evil</u> he had done.
- B. (5,6) The Lord gave Israel a <u>deliver</u>... *Nevertheless* they did not depart from the sins...
 - 1. The love of God, so undeserved and yet so free, might lead us to repentance.
- C. (7) Only 10 chariots? Ahab mustered 2000, 50 years before.

IV. Slide6a **DEATH OF ELISHA (14-21)**

- A. ELISHA IS SICK (14)
- B. **Elijah** was spared the common doom of man, and was taken to heaven in a chariot and horses of fire, *without dying*. But **Elisha**, who would honored God so much longer (60 yrs), goes the way of all the earth. Why the difference?
 - 1. Slide6b "I don't want to die without any scars." ~ Chuck Palahniuk, Fight Club
- C. The King wept over his face kind of a touching picture.
- D. (14b) Seemed to be saying, that this 1 man of God was equal to the whole army of Israel.

- E. *Swing low sweet chariot, comin for to carry me home*. That great spiritual from the late 1800's early 1900's spoke of the chariot swooping low to pick one up to bring to heaven.
- F. Slide7a STOPPING HALFWAY (15-19)
- G. (15-19) Elisha gives 2 orders to Joash. 2 visual aids. 1 to shoot and the other to strike.
- H. Slide7b To Shoot (15-17)
 - 1. The Romans were accustomed to declare war against an enemy by shooting an arrow into their territory. Alexander the Great also did this when he entered Persia. This order therefore was the 1st signal of war. And we know that it was shot eastward towards Syria. But, for what purpose?
 - a) Elisha was the representative of God. He's teaching the king though he should use means, he should not depend upon them.
 - b) The power was not in the weapons, but in God. Therefore it is called *the arrow of the Lord's deliverance* (17).
 - 2. It is the same with us. We work, but God must work with us.
 - a) Slide7c Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, says the Lord. Zech.4:6
 - b) I.e. in Acts 11:21 the apostles went forth preaching...and the hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number believed and turned to the Lord.
- I. Slide7d To Strike (18,19)
 - For Joash to be blamed, he obviously must've been conscious that the action was a sign. His action showed his lukewarmness and his carelessness. He was only for *injuring & slowing down* the enemy, that he should've *destroyed*.
 - Joash lacked spiritual discernment. He didn't understand the will of God.
 He merely went through the motions. As a result he claimed only a *limited* victory.
 - a) He missed his opportunity and could never clean it again.
 - b) What opportunity will got to give you this week that you may never have again?
 - 3. Is this how we deal with our enemy, the devil, and our sin? Do we deal with it *halfheartedly*?
 - 4. Slide7e Or like David did with his enemy, Ps.18:37,38,42 *I chased my enemies* and caught them; I did not stop until they were conquered. 38 I struck them

down so they could not get up; they fell beneath my feet. 42 I ground them as fine as dust in the wind. I swept them into the gutter like dirt.

- a) In these spiritual matters moderation is a crime! Crucify the flesh, not caress it.
- b) How? by giving all *diligence*, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, 6 to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, 7 to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. 2 Pet.1:5-7
- Also think about it, he got exactly what he had *believed* God for.
 Yet he did not receive *everything* that the Lord meant for him to have.
 - a) I wonder if we're owning *all the fullness of His promises* and *all the possibilities* through believing prayer?
 - b) He will only do as much for us as we will allow Him to do in us.
 - (a) The same power that **saved us**, **washed us** with his blood, **filled us** with the power of this Holy Spirit, and **protected us** through numerous temptations, will work **for** us to meet every emergency, every crisis, every circumstance. The Alliance
 - c) Slide7f Let's put *no limit* on God by our *restrained prayer* and *meager faith*. Let us go with Him as far as we may, and only stop when He says, *ask me no more*.
- J. Slide8a THE POSTHUMOUS INFLUENCE OF A GOOD MAN (20,21) paust-u-mus
- K. Then Elisha died yes, the dearest, the greatest, the most useful of God's servants die. But *precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of the Saints*.
 - 1. We are losers, but to them...to die is gain.
 - 2. Their privileged in it, they are privileged by it.
- L. Slide8b This is the story of a funeral gone bad...turned good.
 - 1. Obviously, the virtue was not in the bones of *Elisha*, but in the power of God.
 - 2. Thus, it didn't matter if it was a few days after his death or a few 1000 years. God alone could have done it & did do it.
 - 3. Why is it such a surprise to us that God should raise the dead?
 - a) There will be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust.
- M. Slide8c This also points us to Jesus. Because he died we shall live.

- 1. We know that if we were planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall also be in the likeness of his resurrection.
- 2. Jesus made the grave his own. Behold the place where the Lord Lay.
- 3. Into this grave we must descend. But we shall arise from it not only living, but immortal. Not like this man, to die again, but to die no more, death having no more dominion over us.
- N. Slide8d We also note that we can be used by God even after we die. How? Not by our **bones** but by our **example** we left behind.
 - By the instructions we left behind, which will still speak. By our memory & influence, which will still speak. By the prayers we had offered. By the books we gave. By the funds we sent to missionaries who are still out working in the fields. By your investment into a place of worship. etc.

V. Slide9 RECAPTURING CITIES OF ISRAEL (22-25)

- A. (23) Reminds us of what David said in Ps.103:10, *He does not punish us for all our sins;* he does not deal harshly with us, as we deserve.
 - 1. Note 3 words: *gracious, compassion, regarded* (to direct one's interest, attention, or trust towards something).
- B. Slide10 Question: How can *God's people* have hope in the midst of **societal** and **political** unrest?
 - Ask? Because God is still on the throne. We can still cry out to Him for deliverance or for a deliverer. [so we settle our hearts today in the midst of America's & the world's unrest]
