- II. Slide3 Intro: We 9 Kings of Orient Aren't
 - A. Brian, do I need to know about these 9 kings?...no, but I think you should know about a couple of them. Especially our first king is referred to so much.
 - 1. And we can glean from a few stories of the other guys.
 - B. Slide4 These 2 chapters cover about 80 years. (covering 6 kings from Israel & 3 from Judah) Note: Image of King Chart.

III. Slide5 CHAPTER 15

- A. AZARIAH (aka Uzziah) & JOTHAM (1-7)
- B. Uzziah & Jotham (his son) started well. Were even considered good kings.
 - 1. Unfortunately Azariah/Uzziah became proud and wanted to serve as priest.
 - 2. He was punished by leprosy.
 - 3. Key: accept the sphere of blessing God gives you and do not meddle with matters that are <u>beyond you</u>.
 - a) Slide6 Ps.131:1 Lord, my heart is not proud; my eyes are not haughty. I don't concern myself w/matters too great or too awesome for me to grasp.
- C. Uzziah plays a big part in Scripture.
 - 1. Slide7 Is.1:1 The vision of Isaiah the son of Amoz, which he saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah.
 - 2. Amos 1:1 The words of Amos, who was among the sheepbreeders of Tekoa, which he saw concerning Israel in the days of Uzziah king of Judah...
 - 3. Hos.1:1 The word of the Lord that came to Hosea the son of Beeri, in the days of Uzziah...
 - 4. He was even mentioned in **Jesus family tree** through Joseph's line. Mt.1:8,9
- D. Read 2 Chron 26:15-23

- Slide8a (23) Uzziah was buried in a field for burial that belonged to the kings of Judah, but not in the official tomb of the kings of Judah...because he had leprosy.
 - a) For some reason his bones had to be *reinterred* during time of the NT.
 - b) Slide8b Archaeologists have discovered a marble tombstone in Jerusalem written in Aramaic. The inscription on the tombstone reads, "Here were brought the bones of Uzziah, king of Judah. Do not open it."
- 2. Slide9a Is.6:1-3 Isaiah received his divine call to ministry the year Uzziah died. In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His robe filled the temple. Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!"
 - a) In the year that king Uzziah died This is more than a date on a calendar.
 - (1) Isaiah was dealing with a new era, a new year.
 - (2) Uzziah was basically a *good* king.
 - (3) Once a great hero & king to Isaiah. Until he became powerful...then, he forgot God...then, disobeyed his clear instructions, & so was afflicted w/ leprosy.
 - (a) Struck w/Leprosy 10 years before he died (2 Chron.26:16-20)
 - (b) His heart was lifted up. Entered temple/burnt incense. Leprosy broke out on forehead. Azariah (priest) +80 threw him out.
 - (4) What would happen to the country w/him now gone?
 - b) I saw the Lord This is *Adoni*. Isaiah had a life changing vision of...Jesus.
 - (1) Jn.12:41 These things Isaiah said when he saw <u>His glory</u> and spoke of <u>Him</u> (i.e. His = Jesus)
 - c) What would happen to the country w/him now gone?
 - (1) Well, we have a **King** on a **heavenly throne** that He will always occupy, & always be in control (6:5b *king*).

- (2) When things on **earth** are <u>discouraging</u>, start looking at things from **heavens** point of view.
- d) High & lifted up refer to *Him*, not His throne.
- e) Seraphim Lit. burning one's.
 - (1) In **humility** they cover their faces. In **respect** they cover their feet.
- f) When you worship focus on God's holiness, sovereignty, & glory.
- g) The **3-fold repetition** of **Holy** is unprecedented in *all* of Scripture.
 - (1) *Doubled* was the Hebraic style to show *superlative*. But here, it is raised to the 3rd power.
- h) This year (2018) will you see the Lord?
 - (1) Or, will you only see your **circumstances**? only see your **problems**? only see the **negative things** going on in our world?
- E. Slide9b ZECHARIAH, SHALLUM, MENAHEM (8-22) all Israel
- F. (13) A full month...wow!
- G. (16) Menahem ripped *pregnant women* open.
- H. PEKAHIAH, PEKAH, JOTHAM, & JOTHAM/Judah (23-38)
- I. (19,29) Pul aka Tiglath Pileser III from Assyria. Their Captivity begins.
 - 1. This 1st deportation of the Israelites probably took place in 733 b.c. A second deportation followed 11 years later in 722 b.c.

IV. Slide 10 CHAPTER 16

- A. (3, 14-18) Ahaz *robbed God's temple* to buy protection and he *offered his son* to a heathen god to secure help.
- B. (7) I hate the depth he sinks to... I am your servant & your son. Come up & save me
 - 1. Yet, I guess that's what I whisper to my flesh.
- C. Slidella Some trust in chariots, and some in horses; But we will remember the name of the Lord our God. Ps.20:7
 - 1. No life is more **secure** than a life *surrendered to God*.

- 2. Slide11b When Jonathan Edwards, the great pastor and theologian died unexpectedly from a *smallpox vaccination*, his wife (Sarah Pierpont) wrote these words, "What shall I say? A holy and good God has covered us with a dark cloud. O that we may kiss the rod, & lay our hands on our mouths! The Lord has done it...But my God lives; and he has my heart...We are all given to God."
- D. (10,11) Compare this priest Urijah to Azariah the priest w/his 80 valiant priests.
- E. Instead of following *the divine pattern* for the **altar**, he *borrowed a pattern* from a heathen Temple.
 - 1. Slide12 How often do we substitute *our own* thoughts and plans for *God's*?
 - a) Oh just every time I have thoughts & plans:)
 - b) Actually, I think we can ask ourselves...in these thoughts & plans...who is going to receive the glory (me or God?) In these thoughts & plans for my life...do I believe it will put a smile on my God's face? What would you ask yourself?
 - 2. As God's people we do not need *the novelties of the world*, no matter how *attractive* they may be.
 - 3. It is tragic when we try to worship God after the pattern of the world and not after the heavenly pattern.
 - 4. Are you looking for religious novelties? Guard your altar, keep it intact.
