How to Reap a Whirlwind

 - A. Chapter 8 contains *a collection of poetic sayings* reiterating how the Israelites have strayed from God in their choice of *rulers*, *their religious practices*, *and their foreign policy*.

III. Slide8 CHAPTER 8

- A. AN EXECUTING EAGLE (1-6) Listening to God
- B. Eagle or vulture in Hebrew any large bird of prey.
- C. Slide9 Kierkegaard, the Danish philosopher, told a story about a **goose** who was wounded and who landed in a <u>barnyard</u> with some **chickens**. He <u>played with</u> the chickens and <u>ate with</u> the chickens. After a while that **goose** thought he was a chicken. One day a flight of geese came over, migrating to their home. They gave a **honk** up there in the sky, and he <u>heard</u> it. Kierkegaard said, "Something stirred within the breast of this goose. Something called him to the skies. He began to flap the wings he hadn't used, and he rose a few feet into the air. Then he stopped, and he settled back again into <u>the mud</u> of the barnyard. He heard the cry, but he settled for less."
 - 1. Israel settled for so far less than what God had planned for them & for what He made them for. Have you settled for less? I have. I've heard His cry often... and ended up settling for good, ok or even mediocre, instead of going for His best.
- D. (1) The *shofar* was sounded to *sound an alarm* or *gather the people*.
 - 1. When God sounds the trumpet we better wake up & listen.
 - 2. Slide10 Instead of God bearing them on eagles' wings and bringing them to Himself (Ex.19:4) The **Assyrian Eagle** was about to swoop down on them as his prey.

- a) Deut.28 is about Israel's obedience (1-14) & if there's disobedience (15-68).
- b) Vs.49 says The Lord will bring a nation against you from afar, from the end of the earth, as swift as the **eagle** flies, a nation whose language you will not understand.
- E. My God, We know you! The Israelites are shocked that God is not responding to their cry, *even though* they are simply going through the motions of legalistic ritual.
 - 1. Their outward ritualism conceals an inward rebellion.
- F. Slide11 A DIRT DEVIL (7) sow wind-seeds, reap tornadoes
- G. (7) Sow the wind, reap the whirlwind What seems to be *a lovely wind today* can become an *ugly storm tomorrow*. (ask pastor Rick about the 1 that ran through his backyard Thurs in Wildomar) H. Slide12a We Reap What We Sow.
 - 1. A basic law of physics states that for every action there is an equal and opposite reaction.
 - 2. We **get out of** life what we **put into** it. (This does not mean that we directly cause every event in our lives; we do not)
 - 3. If you cheat in practice, you'll cheat in the game.
 If you cheat in your head, you'll cheat on the test.
 If you cheat on your girl/boyfriends, you'll probably cheat on your spouse.
 If you cheat in business, you'll probably cheat in life.
 - a) Can you think of a time where you *sowed wild oats*, and *reaped a tornado of your own*?
 - 4. Life is a series of **investments** and **returns**.
 - a) Give money receive blessings. Invest money accumulate savings.
 Borrow money incur debt. Venture nothing gain nothing.
 Live honorably receive honor. Study diligently achieve an education.
 Train for athletic competition win prize.
 Show kindness Kindness is often show in return.
 - b) Sow a thought, reap an act. Sow an act, reap a habit. Sow a habit, reap a character. Sow a character, reap a destiny.
- I. Slide12b We Reap the *Same Kind* That We Sow.

- J. Jesus points this out: You will know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes from thornbushes or figs from thistles? Even so, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. Mt.7:16-17
 - 1. The point is simple, but it must be clearly stated: We cannot plant corn and get a harvest of wheat; we cannot plant tomatoes & a harvest of cucumbers.
 - a) Neither can we *plant seeds of criticism, strife and anger* and get a healthy marriage. We cannot *plant seeds of stinginess, self-indulgence, and greed* and reap a harvest of financial blessing. We cannot *plant seeds of poor decisions* and reap a harvest of God's will in our lives. We reap the same kind that we sow.
 - 2. There are 2 types of harvest:
 - a) The flesh. Or the sin nature; the nature of man w/o the Spirit of God.
 - (1) Job 4:8 says, As I have observed those who plow evil and those who sow trouble reap it.
 - (2) Proverbs 22:8 says, Those who plant injustice will harvest disaster.
 - b) **The Spirit.** Sow to the desires and dictates of the Holy Spirit in your life. The results? *The fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.* How do we do that? By **filling** our minds and hearts with the Word, prayer, fellowship, obeying God when He speaks, and by **guarding** our hearts and minds from influences of the world.
- K. Slide12c We Reap in Proportion to What We Sow.
- L. If you've ever planted any kind of fruit or vegetable, you understand this truth. Here are 2 areas of life that illustrates the concept:
 - Relationships. Notice the <u>impact</u> of a <u>kind word</u> or a <u>compliment</u> versus a
 harsh word or criticism. The friendlier we are, the friendlier the world becomes.
 Jesus said, *Do to others as you would have them do to you.*
 - 2. Giving. God stresses that we should sow *generously*. (2Cor.9:6).
- M.Slide12d We Reap in a Different Season Than We Sow.
- N. Paul reminds us that we reap *at just the right time* (Gal.6:9). This contains both a promise & an expectation.
 - 1. Promise. Parenting is an excellent illustration. Proverbs 22:6 reminds us that *if* we train our children right, when they are old, they will not depart from it.

- a) It has been said that raising children is as easy as *nailing a poached egg* to a tree.
- b) Parenting involves making a *long-term investment* in our children.
- c) Many times we get frustrated as parents because we do not see the *immediate payoff of our investment* in our children. They will learn their life lessons *just like we learned them*...over time, with many mistakes, not listening to counsel, and through many *dangers*, *toils and snares*.
- Expectation. We must learn to wait on God's proper season for our lives.
 God's timing is perfect. It's not always according to our schedule or desire. But the promise is sure we will reap in due time.
- O. Slide12e We Reap if We Persevere
 - 1. Gal.6:9 So let's not get tired of doing what is good. At just the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up.
- P. Slide13 A VALUELESS VESSEL (8) a crack in your Tupperware
- Q. (8) Like a vessel in which is no pleasure
 - 1. Israel became a piece of *junk pottery* on the trash heap.
 - 2. We all bring certain *treasures* into our marriages. What did you bring?

 I brought my coveted Plaster Seagulls from Mexico (from bach party, *surfin in Mexico*)
 - a) I displayed them proudly on our **fireplace**. But one day somehow they moved to the **side yard**. Only one day to find them next to the **trash can**.
 - b) I delighted in them...Kelly never did [much like my blacklight crushed velvet dogs playing pool]
 - 3. So with Israel. They had become a worthless vessel...like my seagulls.
- R. Slide14 A DUMB DONKEY (9,10) *vulnerable alone* [word play w/ephraim, wild donkey/pere]
- S. Israel was like a dumb animal that had lost its way in the wilderness. Vulnerable.
 - 1. Israel was forsaken by God & forsaken by her allies, & thus abandoned to face a future alone.
- T. Slide15 AN ANEMIC ALTAR (11-14) many sin altars

- U. (11) Israel/Ephraim multiplied altars; Judah multiplied fortifications (14).
 - Altars of sinning. What if God said (as Paul did at the Areopagus) I was
 passing through and considering the objects of your worship.
 What altars would He find erected there?
 - 2. What altars would He find erected in your life? Your **social media** altar? Your **amount of** *Likes* altar? Your **pride** altar? Your **business** altar? Your **sports** altar? Your **selfi** altar?
- V. (13) Egypt Hosea talks about 13 times.
 - 1. It speaks of Egypt **Past** (the Exodus). Egypt **Present** (Israel's unholy alliance with). Egypt **Future** (as a symbol of their impending bondage to *Assyria*).
 - 2. They shall return to Egypt (lit or fig?) 11:5 makes it clear this is *figurative*.
 - a) Assyria becomes *The New Egypt* if you will.
 - b) What was your bondage **before** salvation? What is it **now**? Did you *substitute it* simply for something else?

IV. Slide16 CHAPTER 9

- A. A HABITUAL HARLOT (1-9) love for hire
- B. Israel's produce is again portrayed as a prostitute's wages.
- C. You made *love for hire* on every threshing floor Wiersbe said, *During the harvest season*, *prostitutes* frequented the threshing floors, where the men slept to guard the grain.
 - 1. Maybe that's why Boaz was so shocked to find a woman at his feet when he was at the threshing floor(aka Ruth) Now it happened at midnight that the man was startled, and turned himself; and there, a woman was lying at his feet.

 And he said, Who are you? So she answered, I am Ruth, your maidservant.
- D. Slide17 WINE IN THE WILDERNESS (10-17) grapes & 1st figs
- E. (10) How <u>did</u> God feel about Israel?
 - 1. You don't find grapes in the desert...but if you did, they would sure be enjoyable. The first figs tasted especially good, as did Israel to their Lord.

- 2. But now He likened them to: that 1 bad seed in a bag of sunflower seeds. Or, a brown spot on a banana. Or, the gooey stuff on a sunny side up egg.
- F. Slide 18 (14) Hosea breaks into a prayer for them.
 - 1. But then he pauses (see dash) for he doesn't know what God should give them.
 - 2. Then he asks, What will You give them?
 - 3. Then the only thing he thinks of is *childlessness* so the miseries of the day would be as limited as possible.
 - a) The fruitful womb was always a blessing, but now the miscarrying womb would be a blessing:(
 - 4. What did Jesus say on the Via Dolorosa while Simon was carrying His cross?
 - a) Let's read Jesus' commentary on this verse Lk.23:26-31 (vs.29 = Hos.9:14) (vs.30 = Hos.10:8)
