# Prosperity vs. Adversity

### II. Slide6 Intro: PROSPERITY vs. ADVERSITY

A. Which is more dangerous to us...*prosperity* or *adversity* in our lives? Why does **Paul** quote this chapter of **Hosea**? Could <u>you</u> ever *forget God*? Is God **sovereign** over <u>evil</u>? Has our world lost all **common sense**?

#### III. PROSPERITY vs. ADVERSITY

- A. Slide7a KISS THE CALVES (1-3)
- B. (1) Ephraim was a great tribe. It had a former place of prominence among the tribes of Israel. But now Ephraim would become *like* the *clouds*, *dew*, *chaff*, & *smoke*...i.e. as nothing. [Like comes up 17 times in these last 2 chapters]
- C. (2) Kiss the calves Yet I have reserved seven thousand in Israel, all whose knees have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him. 1 Kgs.19:18
- D. Ephraim/Israel went from knowing they were to *Kiss the Son lest He be angry* (Ps.2:12) to bowing down & *kissing the golden calves*. [Early onset *relativism*]
  - 1. Israel had lost its power, its strength, its way... & its common sense.
- E. Slide7b That's a big problem today. We don't have common sense in our day & age.
  - 1. CS Lewis, in his allegory *Pilgrims Regress*, is about a man in search of meaning and answers. In it he talks about a man named **John**. He's going from Philosophy to philosophy and ends up at a mountain called *The Spirit of the Age*. Lewis described John as not free, in living for the Spirit of the Age, but his hands are bound in chains living for the Spirit of the Age.
    All of a sudden he's given his breakfast and his hands are unbound to enjoy

- it. As he takes a sip of milk he describe how **delicious** and **nourishing** it is. The waiter that brings it to him representing the Spirit of the Age says, ha, you call it **delicious** and **nourishing** but isn't it simply the secretion of a cow? The cows secrete **urine** & the cow secretes **milk**, you call it delicious & nourishing. John doesn't know where to go from there, and then he made a big mistake, he commented on the tastiness of the **eggs**. (Pause) Now you should hear what the waiter compare the eggs to (menstrual cycle of a fowl). And he had no way to respond. But as he is put back in chains **reason** comes riding on a horse to lift him up & rescue him. And **reason** looks to him who runs the Spirit of the Age said, Sir, you lie, because you don't know the difference between what nature has meant for **nourishment** and what nature has meant for **garbage**.

  [**Milk** feeds calves and **dung** does not]
- a) That distinction is lost today. We have no understanding of what is true, good and beautiful; and what is evil, heinous and destructive.
- b) We consider all choices equally valid, because we no longer know the difference between *what nature has meant for nourishment and what nature has meant for garbage*. [Pilgrim's Regress, C.S.Lewis, ch.8 Parrot Disease]
- F. Slide8a YOU FORGOT ME (4-11)
- G. God would be to the people *like*: a *hungry* lion, a *stalking* leopard & a *ticked-off* bear.
  - 1. The prophets regularly used wild animals to symbolize divine judgment.
- H. He saved them from **Egypt**, He *could have very easily* saved them from **Assyria**.
  - 1. But they trusted their wealth, their kings & their foreign policy.
- I. Being *prosperity privileged* made them *pride filled*.
  - 1. **Agur** in Prov.30 prayed that *he wouldn't be* **so full** so as to <u>deny the Lord</u>; nor **so poor** that he would be <u>tempted to steal</u>.
  - 2. Deut.32:15 But Jeshurun (Israel, the upright one) grew fat (prosperous) and kicked (like an animal kicks, here referring to kicking at God); You grew fat, you grew thick, You are obese. Then he forsook God who made him, And scornfully esteemed (scoffed at) the Rock of his salvation.

- a) The name Jeshurun (yeshurun) derived from the Hebrew word *yashar*, meaning **upright**. This word is used of **God** in Deut 32:4. With deliberate irony, the writer uses *yashar*, which is normally used of **God**, as a pun on Israel, whose Hebrew pronunciation (yisra'el) sounds similar to yashar.
- J. Slide7b (5,6) 40 years of wilderness wandering summed up in this...I knew you in the wilderness, in the land of great drought. (contrast with vs.6) When they had pasture, they were filled; they were filled and their heart was exalted; Therefore they forgot Me.
  - 1. 2 situations. 2 conditions. 2 responses. (wilderness/Canaan)
    - a) God led them from **Egypt** into the wilderness (where He knew them/cared for them)
    - b) God led them from the wilderness into the Promise Land (where He fed them, *lit.* pastured them. *Describes sheep or cattle grazing peacefully*)
      - (1)Yet instead of acknowledging Me & thanking Me...became proud & forgot Me.
  - 2. (vs.5) God You knew me **in my wilderness time** of life, my fallen state, my backslidden state, and still You choose me for Yourself.
    - a) When my *outward circumstances* completely tanked, and I found myself lost, Your sweet presence comforted me. Never once was Your light of love dimmed.
  - 3. (vs.6) God You placed me in a place of both *good and plenty*, where I lacked nothing. There was no shortage of Your *love, grace, or protection*.
    - a) If I acknowledged You at the *worst of times*, then I should recognize You now *in my prosperity*.
  - 4. Prayer: Lord I'll follow You into **the wilderness**, bear my cross, even when the heat of my persecution burns hot. But I pray I wont forget you during the **times of plenty**. I've turned to you in the **night watches**...but help me to <u>trust</u> in the **bright of day**.
    - a) \* Prosperity is often a more dangerous trial than adversity. Prosperity is a great teacher, adversity even greater.
- K. Therefore they forgot me *unmindfulness of God*.
- L. (10,11) God didn't want them to have a king, He wanted to be king over them. But wasn't he sovereign to stop this?

- 1. If He is not sovereign over all things, then He is not God at all.
  - a) By God ordaining all things, He does it in such a way that doesn't annihilate human decisions or the forces of nature. Yet at the same time the sovereign of God stands over every human event. R.C.Sproul [whether by *ordination or permission*]
  - b) Even if His *ordination* is by mere *permission*, for God to *let things happen*, He is choosing to allow them.
- 2. In our limited parenting skills we sometimes let our children touch the *hot* object, let them fall & bruise their knees, or let them suffer the consequences after we had warned them...*it was going to hurt*.
  - a) God's parenting skills are not limited. In fact they are **perfect** w/every individual, every creature, with nature, & with the unseen realm...*all together, at the same time, all the time*.
  - b) He uses **good** & **evil** to accomplish His bidding.
  - c) The worse evil man ever did (killing Jesus), was ordained by God Himself, Him, being delivered by the determined purpose and foreknowledge of God, you have taken by lawless hands, have crucified, and put to death. Acts 4:28 then goes on to say, whom God raised up...

## M. Slide9 BABY ON BOARD (12-16)

- N. (13) The procrastinating nation was compared to a baby that wouldn't come out.
  - 1. NIV Pains as of a woman in childbirth come to him, but he is a child without wisdom; when the time arrives, he does not come to the opening of the womb.
  - 2. Slide10 Here was a baby on board that wouldn't get off board.
- O. (14) Paul takes & expounds on this in 1 Cor.15:55 *O Death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory?* (follows the LXX quote)
- P. (15) Fruitful (Ephraim = doubly fruitful) i.e. *Twice fruitful* would be *fruitful* no more.
- Q. (16) What a *contrast* to Jesus statement in Jn.4:4 regarding **Samaria**, *He needed to go through Samaria*. (i.e. To meet who? *the woman at the well*)
  - 1. Result? And many of the Samaritans of that city <u>believed in Him</u> because of the word of the woman who testified, "He told me all that I ever did." So when

the Samaritans had come to Him, they urged Him to stay with them; and He stayed there two days.

R. I'm going to take the rest of the time on *Pauls commentary of 14b* in 1 Cor.15.

## IV. Slide11 THE DEATH OF DEATH (read 1 Cor.15:50-58)

- A. Slide12 A GENERATION THAT WON'T DIE (52)
- B. There will be a generation that **does not die**.
  - They will not go into the shadow of the valley of death.
     They will not taste the darkness of death. But they shall be changed.
  - 2. No dates are given, but it will be at the exact moment which is in the <u>purpose</u> of **God**. 1 It could happen before this day is through.
- C. Slide13 Remember *Dennis Tito*, the California tycoon, paid **\$20 million** to be *shot up* into space. Who now holds the title as The 1st Space Tourist. [went up w/the Russians in 2001]
  - 1. But Christian, you don't have to pay to be **shot up**, in fact for free you will be Caught up. Not propelled by any <u>earthly</u> effort but by the powerful <u>heavenly</u> magnetism of the Lord...in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.
  - 2. And, you're not going to be called a tourist up there, but a Local.
- D. Slide14 CLOTHED WITH INCORRUPTION (53)
- E. Not only *will* but **must** (twice).
- F. A redeemed **spirit**, without a **body**, will be awaiting that day of resurrection.
  - 1. 2 Cor.5:4 For we who are in this tent groan, being burdened, not because we want to be **unclothed**, but **further clothed**, that mortality may be swallowed up by life.
  - 2. **Death** cannot touch the **soul** or the **spirit** of the Christian. It only touches the **body**...*but only for a bit*.
- G. Slide15 THE DEATH OF DEATH (54,55)
- H. Here is an assurance that comforts us... Death is de-clawed.
- I. Swallowed up to drink down. (down the hatch)

- J. (55) Here is where Paul dares to laugh at death & the grave.
  - 1. He confronts an enemy which has held in its grip <u>every human</u> being throughout all history...except 2.
    - a) **Enoch** who <u>went</u> for a walk with God & never came back. And **Elijah** who was taken up to heaven as the real *1st space tourist* in his chariot of fire.
- K. Death which swallowed up, will now be swallowed up.
- L. Deaths stinger is removed!
- M. Sting represents death as a venomous creature, a scorpion, or a hornet rendered harmless.
  - 1. Death for the believer is like a de-clawed cat, de-fanged rattlesnake, or a scorpion w/o its stinger.
  - 2. Its like a **bee** which has <u>already stung</u> & now is left <u>harmless</u> to ever sting again.
- N. Note Death & Hades representing both the material & non-material world.
- O. Slide16 VICTORY (56,57)
- P. Sin is cancelled & the strength of the Law to condemn us is removed...because it has been fulfilled in Jesus Christ.
- Q. **Death** is no longer our <u>enemy</u> then Christian, but an instrument of **freedom** <u>from</u> the reign of sin in our body.
  - 1. There will always be *the human fear* of <u>entering the valley of death</u>...unless Jesus comes 1st.
  - 2. Death for the believer becomes like **a friend** who leads you to **a drawn curtain**, which has been hiding the full Glory of the Savior from your eyes & then throws it open.
  - 3. Death is like **the doors** at the back of our sanctuary during one of our weddings.
    - a) They are the only thing that stands between the **bride** & **her groom**.
    - b) Once they are flung open they both behold each other in all their splendor.

### V. Slide17 MEANWHILE...PERSEVERE (58)

A. We end with a call that *challenges us* - Prepare for Victory...How? 4 things:

- 1. Be **steadfast** (firm), **Immovable** (Set your sail & stay on course), Always **abound** in the work of the Lord, Knowing that your **labor** is not in vain.
  - a) Slide18 Did you know: *A honey bee* visits 50-100 flowers per trip out of the hive. Flying at 15 mph. W/a wing stroke of 11,400 times per minute (thus making their distinctive buzz). Making approximately 10 trips per day. And they do this each day of their whole life, as a forager.
    - (1) Her life is only about 4-6 weeks. She literally works herself to death.

      All this for...wait for it...1/12th of a teaspoon of honey in their lifetime!
    - (2) Always abound in the work of the Lord that He has set before **you**.
- 2. Know that your labor is not in vain (when it's in the Lord)
  - a) What do I receive for all my hard labor? well we are assured of the <u>promise</u> of reward. For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love. Heb.6:10
  - b) But be like **the bee**...she doesn't do all of that hard work for **herself**...*matter of* fact Honey bee's are **selfless**.
    - (1) It would only take approximately **1 ounce** of honey to fuel a bee's flight *around the world*. So they are not just making it for themselves.
    - (2) Much of the honey is *for the good of the hive* to survive doing the winter when flowers aren't in bloom. And for the nurse bee's to feed the larva. And for human's to steal to put on their toast.
- B. This Victory ahead is for **Christians**. Death is no friend to the **un**believer, it is an *enemy*.
  - 1. Death becomes, not a **curtain** separating a bride & a groom, but instead it is like a **prison door**, that opens for the prisoner...only to be escorted to His execution.
  - 2. It need not be so. Look unto *Jesus* as the author & finisher of your faith.
