"Wrestling - Watching - Waiting!"

1. Intro:

- 1.1. Q: Do you ever have problems that vex, annoy, or irritate your soul?
 - 1.1.1. Ex: Maybe when God seems to be **indifferent** to your <u>prayers</u> or to <u>evil</u> around you? Why do good people suffer? Why do evil people prosper? When I'm doing my best for God, why do experience the worst from others?
 - 1.1.2. Some Christians claim to be w/o problems!
 - 1.1.2.1. That means:
 - a) They are not telling the truth.
 - b) They are not growing & experiencing real life.
 - c} They are not thinking at all. (they've blocked out reality & stifled honest feelings) [they are like Jobs uncomfortable comforters]
 - 1.1.3. Some choose to deal w/it by: **living w**/their doubts, **ignoring** them & **moving on** with life as best they can.
 - 1.1.4. Others become cynical & hardened.
 - 1.1.5. Then others...climb in the ring & wrestle it through w/God.
 - 1.1.5.1. Habakkuk found himself center ring struggling with some hard issues & serious problems with God!
 - 1.1.5.2. But note...that's where to take these problems! To Him!!!
- 1.2. Habakkuk's writing is right at Judah's 11th hour.
 - 1.2.1. We have only 3 more Minor Prophets left (see notes at end of OT)
- 1.3. **Habakkuk** means "embrace" ("one who embraces[or clings]")
 - 1.3.1. At the end of the book you'll see him **cling** tightly to the Lord.
 - 1.3.2. Some have called him the OT Socrates! (i.e. Q & A)
 - 1.3.3. He was a contemporary of Jeremiah.
 - 1.3.4. This book begins with a **sob** & ends w/a **song!**
- 1.4. **Outline:** Wrestling Watching Waiting.

2. WRESTLING! (ch.1)

- 2.1. Question: Why is God so indifferent toward evil? (1:1-4)
- 2.2. Jehoiakim had been leading the nation closer to disaster.

- 2.2.1. Jeremiah said & prophesied of him, "...your eyes and your heart are for nothing but your covetousness, For shedding innocent blood, And practicing oppression and violence...He shall be buried with the burial of a donkey, Dragged and cast out beyond the gates of Jerusalem." (22:17,19)
- 2.3. Habakkuk prays, "why don't you do something about the violence, strife, & injustice in the land"?
 - 2.3.1. But God didn't seem to hear...so he cries out louder(see 2 diff Heb. words)
- 2.4. (4) The biggest problem in Judah was their **leadership** wouldn't obey God's law.
- 2.5. Answer: God says I will deal w/evil...the Babylonians are coming to punish your evil? (5-11)
- 2.6. (5) God answers & assures him that He is at work among the nations even though he couldn't see it.
 - 2.6.1. So God gives Habakkuk a **revelation**, not an **explanation!**
 - 2.6.2. The Lord never owes us any explanations, but He graciously reveals Himself & His work to those who seek Him!
 - 2.6.3. And this is what we need in times of doubt...a fresh view of God!
- 2.7. (6,7) Habakkuk's country would become like **sitting ducks** before the **Babylonian duck hunters**.
- 2.8. (8-10a) Their **horses** are as fast as leopards; they are more ferocious then **wolves** that hadn't eaten all day; their troops swoop down on their prey like **vultures**; they sweep across the desert like **wind**; they **collect captives** as we would gather shells on the beach; they captured **royalty** & put them on humiliating public display(often put them in cages).
 - 2.8.1. When **Nebuchadnezzar** captured **Zedekiah**(Judah's last king) & put his sons to death in front of him, then put his eyes out! (2 Kings 25:5-7)
- 2.9. (10b) heap up earthen mounds They laughed at gates & walls for no fortress could w/stand them. They were skilled at building earthen siege ramps.

- 2.10. (11) Though they were **appointed by God**, they would still be **held accountable** for their **ruthlessness**(we'll see in 2:5-20).
- 2.11. Question: How could God be so inconsistent? (12-17)
- 2.12. God's 1st answer wasn't an answer at all...in fact it stirred up new problems! God seemed to show inconsistency.
 - 2.12.1. Q: How could God, whose eyes were "too pure than to behold evil", choose such a wicked, merciless, & idolatrous nation to punish His own people?
 - 2.12.2. **Habakkuk** seemed to be stumped like **Job** by God's apparent distortion of justice!
 - 2.12.3. (12,13a) He focuses in on Gods holiness!
- 2.13. (12) Note "my" (2 times)
 - 2.13.1. This isn't simply a **national** problem, nor a **theological** problem, but this is a **personal** problem!
 - 2.13.2. Wrestling w/problems like this help our faith muscles to grow!
- 2.14. (13b-15) We move from a **Holy** God to a **helpless** people!
 - 2.14.1. Q: Ok, your people deserved punishment, but couldn't you have used a better instrument?
 - 2.14.1.1.But...when we <u>deserve</u> correction, how can we complain about the **kind of rod** God uses on us?
 - 2.14.2. But by the way he had tried other ways 1st: Wars; natural calamities; the preaching of many prophets(eg. Jer. for 40 yrs.); & can you say "Assyria"?
 - 2.14.2.1. The greater the **light** the greater the **responsibility!**
 - 2.14.2.2. The sin in the life of a **believer** is <u>far greater</u> then that of a **non-believer**!
 - 2.14.2.3. "When God's people deliberately disobey Him, they sin against a **flood of** light & an ocean of love!" (www)
- 2.15. (16,17) Their god was "power"! (see vs.11)
 - 2.15.1. They trusted in their military might, their magnet, it's here called, "their net"!

- 2.15.2. They were puffed up w/pride, self-confidence.
- 2.15.3. Habakkuk could have added...but Lord they worship Bel(the head of their pantheon of gods); Anu god of the sky; Nebo god of literature & wisdom; Nergal the sun god; Ea god of magic.
- 2.15.4. Habakkuk finished his defense & waited for God to speak.
- 2.16. Q: Do you just let tough questions go by? Do you settle for ½ truths? Are you fine w/pat answers? If so, you will remain spiritually immature!
 - 2.16.1. I think it is a <u>lazy excuse</u> to say, "that's for pastors/scholars to figure out"!
 - 2.16.2. Face questions honestly; talk them through w/the Lord.
 - 2.16.3. We are called to "grow in the **grace** and **knowledge** of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."
- 2.17. Habakkuk cries out, "*God say something, do something*"…but God was silent & seemingly inactive!
 - 2.17.1. **David** had this same problem in Ps.37; **Asaph** did in Ps.73.

3. **WATCHING!** (2:1)

- 3.1. So he waited, as a **sentinel** <u>standing watch</u>, for the Lord to answer & untangle this knotty dilemma.¹
 - 3.1.1. Of course the watchman in the watchtower was responsible to warn the city of approaching danger.
 - 3.1.2. Just as we are to be watchmen today! What is our warning?
 - 3.1.2.1. As John said, "flee from the wrath to come!" Jesus said, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
- 3.2. It is good to wrestle w/God about the questions that perplex you just be sure to **stop talking long enough to listen!**
 - 3.2.1. "Be still, and know that [he is] God". Ps.46:10
- 3.3. Habakkuk picked the city watchtower for his sanctuary, to listen to the Lord...where's yours?

4. **WAITING!** (2:2-4)

- 4.1. **Answer: The Babylonians will be punished also?** (2-4; to end of ch.)
- 4.2. The Lord graciously answers him & gave him the vision he needed to turn his **worrying** into **worship**(ch.3)
- 4.3. (2) 1st God's response was for him to write it down. 2nd make it plain on tablets. 3rd make it for easy reading.
 - 4.3.1. It was to be Permanent, Plain, & Public! (this message wasn't only for him...he was to share it)
- 4.4. (3) This vision was given **for** a future time & **about** a future time.
 - 4.4.1. Babylon & the 2nd coming of Christ.
 - 4.4.2. Though it tarries wait for it (i.e. Babylon)
 - 4.4.3. The writer of Hebrews interprets it to refer to the return of Christ. "For yet a little while, And **He** who is coming will come and will not tarry." Heb.10:37
 - 4.4.4. Where is the promise of His coming? Wait for it! It will surely come!
- 4.5. (4) The just shall live by his faith (interesting, it takes 3 NT epistles to explain 1 OT text)²
 - 4.5.1. Rom. 1:17 the theme is "the just" & how to be justified before God.
 - 4.5.2. Gal. 3:11 show us how the just "shall live".
 - 4.5.3. Heb. 10:38 the emphasis is on living "by faith".4.5.3.1. Faith is learning to live by insight rather than by sight.
 - 4.5.4. This was of course the watch word for the reformation. As one put it "the 7 most important monosyllables in all of church history!"
 - 4.5.4.1. It was this verse quoted in Rom.1:17 that ignited Martin Luther's spirit & set him on fire!
 - 4.5.4.2. It was to him as he said, "the true gate to paradise!"
 - 4.5.4.3. Understanding for the 1st time the **depth & understanding** of "justification by faith alone" [sola fide/faith alone] (i.e. not works)
- 4.6. We are not only to be **saved** by faith but we are to **live** by faith!
 - 4.6.1. To *live by faith* means to: **believe** God's Word & **obey it** no matter how we feel, what we see, or what the consequences may be.
 - 4.6.2. 1 Jn.5:4 "this is the victory that has overcome the world; our faith."
