

## BUILDING WALLS

The New Living Translation words Proverbs 17:19 in an interesting way; "Anyone who trusts in high walls invites disaster." I think it caught my eye because of all the talk about a "wall" lately. (When Brian

and I were on vacation, one woman we met heard we were from California and the one question she had for us was, "So, what do you think about the wall"? I deflected) I grabbed a few other translations to see how this particular verse was phrased. The NKJ says, "He who exalts his gate seeks destruction." I wondered why someone would "trust in high walls" or "exalt their gate." I did a little research and it

seems that the Psalmist is basically talking about taking pride and trusting in something else besides the Lord. Most believe it's referring to the gate of one's actual house, which, in those days, would usually be more of a humble entrance. It seems to be talking about someone who adopts a lifestyle above their means to outshine their neighbor by building some type of huge, ornate door or gate. This can be the effect and evidence of pride, a haughty spirit, and quickly lead one to ruin. So basically, trusting in high walls, or your gate, or anything else besides the Lord, is a waste of time. Pride leads to destruction. But I began to contemplate the "high walls" that we often place around our hearts and our lives, thinking they will bring us security and worth. What do we trust in to keep us safe? What do we build in our lives to impress others? Do I want people to think more highly of me by what I do or what I possess? I also pondered other types of walls that we build. Walls

can keep predators out, prevent attacks from the enemy, and keep things in that should stay in. But If I build walls around my heart to stay safe because of previous pain or fear, it keeps me from being honest and vulnerable with others. If I build walls around myself and think I can keep myself "safe," I am deceived. I can't trust in walls or gates. I can't trust in my career or my friends. I certainly can't trust in myself or my own wisdom. The Lord should be the only One I trust. It's when I am weak that He is strong, like the apostle Paul said in 2 Corinthians 12:10. Psalm 147:10-11 says "He takes no pleasure in the strength of a horse or in human might. No, the Lord's delight is in those who fear Him, those who put their hope in His unfailing love." If you want to guarantee disaster and ruin in your life, trust anything "but" God. Psalm 146:3 tells us "not to put our confidence in powerful people, there is no help for us there." Proverbs 18:11 says, "The rich think of their wealth as a strong defense; they imagine it to be a high wall of safety."

So, let me ask you this ... what kind of wall are you building? Is it to keep you safe? Is it to impress others? Is it to hide behind? Is it to prevent others from knowing the real you? Is it to keep pain out? Is it because of fear, pride, or hopelessness? Will you knock down that wall and trust in God, your Mighty Fortress? Will you let Him be your protector, your shelter, your hope, your worth, your confidence, and your strength? Are you willing to tear down any wall or gate that prevents Him from penetrating your heart fully? I pray that we don't "invite disaster" into our lives by misplacing our trust. Trust in Him and Him alone!





## **Ingredients:**

- 8 organic chicken breast tenderloins lightly pounded
- 1 tbs egg + 2 water lightly beaten
- 1/2 c parmigiano reggiano cheese freshly grated
- 2 c plain panko bread crumbs
- 1/4 c olive oil
- 1 c arrabiata sauce
- 1 1/2 c whole milk mozzarella cheese shredded
- 1/2 tsp sea salt
- 1/2 tsp black pepper freshly grounded
- 8 oz egg noodle fettuccine

#### For The Alfredo Sauce Recipe:


- 2 1/2 c organic heavy whipping cream
- 3 tbs cold butter
- 3/4 c parmigiano reggiano freshly grated
- · dash of Nutmeg freshly grated

### Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350"F.
- Heat up the olive oil in a cast iron skillet. Season each side of the chicken fillets with a good pinch of the sea salt and black pepper all over.
- Mix the parmigiano reggiano cheese and the panko bread crumbs together. Dredge the chicken tenderloin in the egg and then the bread crumb mixture, coating evenly. Shake any excess and cook in the olive oil until golden brown, about 2 minutes on each side.
- Spoon some of the tomato arrabiata sauce on the bottom of baking sheet and transfer the cooked chicken on top. Spoon some of the arrabiata sauce on top of the chicken and sprinkle with the cheese.
- Loosely cover with aluminum foil and place in the preheated oven for a few minutes until the cheese has melted.
- Meanwhile bring a pot of water to a boil, salt it generously and cook the noodles according to the instructions on the package. If you made your own fresh pasta, about 3 minutes.

- Alternatively, you can heat up the oven to broiler and transfer the chicken to a broiler proof tray. Sprinkle with half of the mozzarella and spoon some of the marinara sauce on top. Sprinkle with the rest of the mozzarella and broil until the cheese has melted. About 3 minutes or so, depending on how close you have it to the flame.
- Meanwhile prepare the Alfredo sauce:
- To make the Alfredo sauce, heat up the cream in a sauce pan over medium flame. Once it starts to simmer start adding the parmigiano reggianno cheese a little bit at a time, whisking constantly until the sauce starts to thicken. (about 5 minutes)
- Once the sauce has thickened, remove from flame and whisk in the cold butter and nutmeg. Toss with the fettuccine and serve with freshly cracked black pepper on top next to the chicken parmigiana. Mash together butter, blue cheese, chives, and 1/8 teaspoon of black pepper; set aside. Cook the steak on the preheated grill to desired degree of doneness, about 5 minutes per side for medium-rare. Allow the steak to rest in a warm place for 10 minutes before slicing thinly across the grain. Serve with a dollop
