Sun-Dried Tomato & Bleu Cheese Burgers

"These hamburgers combine ground beef with sundried tomatoes, blue cheese, Worcestershire sauce, and dry mustard. These are best on the grill for great flavor."

Ingredients

- •3 pounds uncooked lean ground beef
- 1 cup diced sun-dried tomatoes
- 4 ounces blue cheese
- 1/2 cup minced fresh chives
- 1 tablespoon steak sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 1/4 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon coarsely ground black pepper
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 12 hamburger rolls


Directions:

- In a large bowl, mix the ground beef, sun-dried tomatoes, blue cheese, chives, steak sauce, hot pepper sauce, Worcestershire sauce, black pepper, salt, and mustard. Cover and refridgerate for two hours.
- Preheart an outdoor grill for high heat. Gently form mixture into twelve equally-sized patties.
- Grill burgers for five minutes per side, or to desired doneness. Serve on rolls.

Bash Costly



This update introduces you to the last two ladies we worked with from the Seed Center back in Chiang Mai. In the following updates, we will start sharing our students' stories with you. You are in for a treat! The hard part for us will be, which of the powerful 60 stories will we have time to share with you?

Meet our friend Nang Jing Boon (pictured with Mical above, lower right)

Jing Boon was born in Shan State in 1994. Due to the fighting in her village, her family was forced to move to Thailand when she was 5 years old. She is the middle of three children. Her parents worked to grow trees in the forest for the government and are still farmers today. Fortunately for Jing Boon, she was able to study in the Thai school and worked hard to finish her high school education. In addition to her studies she would help her parents work. In 2011, she applied for the SSSNY program in Chiang Mai and was accepted! After she graduated she started working for Shan Youth Power and taught Thai and English in the construction camps. Now she teaches at the Seed Center as well to the local migrant workers at night. Her dream is for migrant people to have rights in Thailand. Since she doesn't have government ID it has been hard for her to get jobs and study after high school.

Meet our friend Nang Poung Boon (pictured with Mical above, left)

Poung was born in Shan State in 1993. She is the middle of three sisters and is also from a farming family. Her village was threatened by the fighting when she was 3 and her family fled to the Thailand border. Poung and Jing Boon actually met when they were just kids! She went to a Thai school for two years before her family moved inland to Chiang Mai. She was unable to attend more school after the move because the family needed for her to help work. She was a housekeeper and a nanny and earned 50 THB a day (\$1.47). She joined the Shan Youth Power program and worked with them for two years. In 2012, she studied hard and was able to get into the SSSNY program herself! It was there that she learned about Burmese history and all her country was going through. That program inspired her to continue to help her community.

SYP told her about the Seed Center. As a result, she now teaches Thai to migrant workers twice a week and in the construction camps three times a week. She loves the opportunity to improve the lives of the Shan people in Thailand. She says that the Shan people who know English or Thai will have opportunities to earn more money, get better jobs, and qualify for more schooling. Her dreams are to travel, meet new people, and for Burma to change. She hopes that Burmese people can live without fear. She has extended family back in Shan State, but she cannot travel back to their home due to the lack of ID cards and permission.

These stories are short, but powerful for a few reasons. These girls have the SWEETEST personalities and a deep love for their people. They dedicate their lives to helping others. They do not make much money working at Seed. Since they know English, they could be trying to get better jobs and earn more money (Aka- the American way), but they are content to earn little, while helping others. We are inspired by their hearts and passion. Pray for these sweet friends to discover Jesus and the saving grace He gives.
